## Walike, Ackerman are valedictorian and salutatorian at HF-L

Classmates in the Honeoye Falls-Lima Class of 2020, Casey Walike and Phil Ackerman will be classmates in the Class of 2024 at Cornell University. The duo are also at the head of the class at HF-L as Walike earned the honor of being the valedictorian this year while Ackerman is the salutatorian.

Walike, the daughter of Joann and Bradley Walike, will attend Cornell to study environmental engineering. She also looked at attending either Clarkson or Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute before choosing Cornell.

Walike carried an academic average of 98/99 while taking some difficult courses such as Advanced Placement Calculus BC, AP U.S. History, AP English Language, AP English Literature, AP Spanish, AP Advanced Drawing and Painting, AP Chemistry, AP Physics 1 and AP Physics 2.

"I like math and science and I like spending time outdoors in nature," Walike said. "All my activities involve being outside so my intended major of environmental engineering comes from those factors."

While academics were important to Walike, she also took the time to involve herself in school fully through clubs and extracurricular activities. She was a member of National Honor Society, Green Team, Math Club and tutored other students in math.

Walike, 18, was busy outside of school as well. She volunteered at the Black Diamond Half Marathon and the Youth Trophy Cup Races by helping set up, do the timing and compile results. Through the HF-L Community Programs, she was a lifeguard and swim instructor.

Walike received the Clarkson Achievement Award and was recognized as a Monroe County Scholar Athlete several times.

A three-sport athlete, Walike swam on the varsity swim team for four seasons before switching to cross country running this past fall. She took second at the Section V Class B Cross Country Championship last fall with a time of 19 minutes, 52.4 seconds and 42<sup>nd</sup> at the state Class B championship (18:28.1). For her performances all season, she was named to the All-Greater Rochester 1<sup>st</sup> team. Walike was a member of the varsity Nordic Ski team for four years, placing eighth in 28:52.1 at the Section V Championships and 17<sup>th</sup> (26:00.6) at the state championship this winter. She would have concluded her fourth year on varsity track this spring if the high school spring sports season had not been cancelled. As a junior, she placed second (4:58.82) in the 1500 meters and second (11:13.48) in the 3000 meters at the Section V Class B Championships, garnering All-League 1<sup>st</sup> team honors for her performances. She may join an outdoor club team at Cornell.

One of her favorite memories is of the Section V Championships in track last year as both the boys and girls teams

## McGuire and Gallatin named valedictorian, salutatorian at LCS

One wants to study criminal psychology because she is fascinated by how the mind works while another wants to study nursing in part thanks to inspiration from her grandmother, but Mariah McGuire and Georgia Gallatin are alike in pursuing academic excellence. It is the reason why McGuire and Gallatin earned the honor of being the valedictorian and salutatorian, respectively, of the Class of 2020 at Lima Christian School.

McGuire, the daughter of Lorenne and Jason McGuire of Lima, will be heading to Liberty University this fall to study criminal psychology. She also

considered Cedarville University and Houghton College. McGuire held a 4.0 average despite taking some challenging courses such as Advanced Placement English Literature and Composition, a statistics class through Genesee Community College and English 101 through Roberts Wesleyan College.

Her involvement in school extended to clubs and activities such as National Honor Society for two years, the School Worship Team for four years and the Mentors for Minis program, which pairs a high school student with a student in the elementary grade level, for the past three years. In addition, McGuire served as the Class of 2020 President as a freshman, sophomore and junior. She was the Student Council President this year. As a freshman, she sang in the school choir.

Outside of school, McGuire was involved in the church youth group at Lima Baptist Church for a couple of years.

McGuire, 18, received an English Department Award as a junior and as a senior.

A three-sport athlete at Lima Christian, McGuire played on the varsity soccer team all four years of high school. A co-captain as a senior last fall, McGuire was a starter on defense but also showed an ability to score

as she recorded two goals. Showing her versatility and adaptability, she moved to goalie for the final five games of the year and picked up 53 saves. McGuire was named an All-League 1<sup>st</sup> team selection in both her junior and senior years. She played for the varsity basketball team for three seasons. A co-captain as a senior, she was a starting forward and scored 118 points (6.2 points a game), which was fourth-highest on the team. McGuire earned All-League 1<sup>st</sup> team honors as a junior and as a senior in the sport. She also played varsity softball and this spring would've marked her fourth year on the varsity. A co-captain as a sophomore, McGuire was one of the reasons why the Lady Saints earned

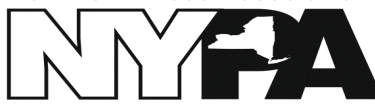

### Town of Rush

Gerald Kusse, Supervisor:

"Rush is the best kept secret in Western New York! I know that we have conservatively budgeted for the year and it would take one large swing of revenue to bring us a lot of pain. I think we're going to see a little pain but not a lot of pain and I'm thankful for that. Even considering that we've already purchased a new \$240,000 excavator, I think about that and I say, 'Oh my gosh, I wish I had known that earlier!' but I didn't. So we're in a 'wait and see' hold right now to see what the impact of all the sales tax and mortgage tax and all that stuff is going to be on us. I remain hopeful."

"Our three restaurants in town are open with outside seating. I think they're going to be opening very soon with inside seating at least I hope they will."

"Someone told me this morning that people are in a different mood than they have been historically. I'm not talking about positive moods. I'm talking about feisty moods because of maybe being holed up for so long. I hope by next week at this time, we can see some hallelujah and say this is what we know now."

# Town & Village Update

## Mayor, Supervisor Weekly Update NY State Sales Tax Data Trickles In: Not Good

### Town of Mendon

John Moffitt, Supervisor:

"We're looking at opening up Town Hall – as far as unlocking the doors and not having to schedule an appointment – after Fourth of July weekend."

"The Highway Department has been out doing a lot of road work within the Town of Mendon. It's mostly stone and oil, which usually doesn't make a whole lot of people happy. Most of those roads are county roads, so the county decides the treatment that's going to be done to those roads. Stone and oil are much more cost efficient than resurfacing but I know a lot of people are concerned about stone."

"The other thing that we've been working on, like everyone else, is our equipment purchases. Everything we've ordered we're going to receive but, yet, there's a couple other things that we have in the hopper that we're not really going to follow through with."

"Once the month of June is closed for us from a financial standpoint, we'll have a better look because we're on the calendar year, as far as fiscal matters go. We'll have a better opportunity to take a look at the first six months. It's probably going to be August before we have a real good idea on sales tax and where that's going to lead. But as I've mentioned previously, we had earmarked some funding to go into reserves. If we have shortfalls in revenue, then we won't put any money into reserves. I'm not really anticipating anything too major at this point as far as financial hardship, but I also have heard some of the numbers that some of the other mayors and supervisors have mentioned. They're pretty drastic numbers in sales tax. We just received our mortgage tax from the county and that was up a little bit, which is always good news, compared to last year."

"Hopefully we're going to weather the storm here and it's nice to see some businesses reopening, expanding hours, those types of things. I think it means a lot to the people in the community that our businesses are open and that they can reopen and it means a lot to the business owners that the community members are supporting them."

### Village of Honeoye Falls

Rick Milne, Mayor:

"I think our sales tax numbers are very similar and I think we're really not all that far off from Livingston County as well. They start talking about sales tax revenue in April being down 24.3% and maybe down 32.3% overall statewide. It's going to balance out. We know we're going to be behind. Our first quarter receipt was slightly higher this year than it was last year, within a couple thousand dollars. We will be finishing up the second quarter and then probably in August, or whatever, we'll see what our real numbers are. We're anticipating them being down significantly."

"I would think most of us probably budget sales tax revenue on the light side trying to be cautiously optimistic. We know we're going to take a hit. We're just trying to look at every penny and what we've already committed to. That's one of the things we struggle with as well. Before this all hit, we had already planned on and ordered two new dump trucks for our DPW department."

"Not only were we already committed to that, but they've come in two months early. So, we're trying to figure all that out. We've got to sell our other two older trucks and see what we get for that. It's a struggle. It's just like everyone's home budget. We had a pretty good plan in place. Certainly we're not expecting what we fallen into. Right now, we'll have to wait and see what that second quarter check is, where we're at and then we're certainly going to jump into our budget discussions."

"In the Village, because of our fiscal year, we usually don't really start that discussion much before December or January and really get into it January and February. We're going to obviously be looking at that in September and seeing what kind of cuts we have to make. Are there any programs that we're involved in that we have to terminate for a period of time? Are there any projects that we wanted to do that we have to postpone? We'll do what we have to do, but at the same time, we have to keep business running. And we do have a major project, a major storm sewer project that we've got to move forward on. We've made a commitment and we have to make it happen somehow. So we're hoping we don't have to bond it and do a long term finance proposition of this, but we're going to do what we have to do, because it's got to get done."

"Businesses are, again, like everybody else. Some of the businesses are opening. It's nice to see Flaherty's opening and then at the same time, we have The Brewery close permanently. We wish them the very best. They certainly are due their retirement. It would have been nice to have somebody else just moving right in. So, you know, we're going to struggle here and there, but that's business and that would have happened COVID or not. I think our residents and our business owners are all working hard to try to move things forward."

"Supervisor Moffitt and I talk very, very frequently, about various different things and we continue to have great relationships with our other surrounding municipalities and we said, we appreciate everything they do. You know we're all in this together and we're just going to keep plugging along and doing the best we can."

"We are indeed open full-time hours with a half staff, but we're expecting that after next week, the beginning of July or just before we'll be back with full staff as well. But we are fully open by appointment only, if you've come to the door and or call ahead, we'll let you in. You have to wear a mask into the office, but we are all back open full-time hours."

### Village of Scottsville

Eileen Hansen, Mayor:

"Things are going well. It's pretty quiet. We're still doing the Village Hall by appointment with only one entrance and one exit. Get your appointment, we'll meet you at the door and let you in. For your Village taxes, you can mail them in or make an appointment at this time."

"Our next board meeting is July 14th. The last one we did remotely and we're still discussing how we're going to do the July meeting and see if we can open it up."

"In terms of sales tax, we got our first quarter and that was pretty much on par with what we have received before. But the information that we've gotten is that in April, the sales tax was down 24 to 25%. In May it looks like it was down about 35%, so we don't know what that's going to look like. In our budget this year and for the past couple of years, we have under budgeted the sales tax. So, we've gotten more than we had planned on. When we did the budget this year, we gave ourselves a small increase in what we were getting. We're hoping we're being frugal and that would mean we may be able to absorb some of it. Because of certain circumstances this past year – we had two people retire so we have a bit of a surplus – we hope that will be able to cushion us with the decrease in sales tax."

"In terms of openings in the Village, we have one restaurant that has opened in Phase Three with a 50% seating inside and then some outdoor seating, which we extended their license to give them a little more space out there. Regarding the other eating establishments, one is still doing it by takeout only and one is waiting until Phase Four before they reopen."

"In terms of anything going on this summer, there's not a lot. The Town of Wheatland is still working on a day camp. We always have had a summer recreation program down at Johnson Park. I know that recreation program is run by the Town. They are working on that. I haven't gotten any details from them."

"The only thing that we usually have going on in the summer is the chamber does a float for Santa, which raises money for our parade of lights. We're still waiting on that. That would probably be in August. We're waiting on some more information on what we can and cannot do with that. It's floating down Oatka Creek and then there's a tent at Canawaugus Park. Probably that's the main concern is any large group of people at the park. So we're waiting for some more information on that."

### Town of Lima

Mike Falk, Supervisor:

"We're very excited about phase four possibly commencing the 26th. Still not sure all that it means, but it does look good, that we will be able to move forward."

"The election site in Lima for Tuesday's election has been moved. It is now at the Lima town hall, it's no longer at the GCC campus."

"About the sales tax, right now the last draw for the town of Lima was off a tad. But it's because it's a quarterly draw, we were still getting some decent returns from the beginning of the year. Livingston County as a whole, though, is down 30%. The Livingston County is the county draw and that is a lot more frequent. So that would be the monthly number. This is compared to the last draw from the last time last year. It's about \$2 million that we're not seeing. One researcher indicated that folks in higher tax brackets severely reduced their spending during the COVID lockdown. That is accounting for a big chunk of the missing sales tax."

"The DMV in Genesee is open with limited transactions. It's a 'call ahead' kind of thing. Everyone who has gone in has said that it has been exceedingly quick with no lines. You go right in for your appointment and you're right out."

"We're going to be having a public hearing on water rates for all four Town of Lima water districts. This is not the Village of Lima water district. It is for water districts that the Town operates outside of the Village. We're going to be discussing rate increases based on the increases given to us to by our water suppliers. That will be with in conjunction with the town board meeting, which is July 7th at 6pm. This is an in person meeting here at the Town Hall with all applicable – distancing and masking and what not."

### Village of Lima

John Correll, Mayor:

"Lima July 4th fireworks at Mark Tubbs Park are cancelled and will not be happening. We have reopened the playground and Rotary Pavilion at Mark Tubbs Park. While we encourage usage, we certainly hope all will respect social distancing. The Village is still planning on applying for the NY State Parks Grant if the window is open this year, typically the deadline is mid-July. We have been doing some upgrades, added horseshoe pits, new kiosk by Eagle Scout Kyle Biter, and the girl scouts are working on trail maps as we speak. Trustee John Wadach has been volunteering a number of hours at the park painting and sprucing up planters. Volunteer Gigi Correll has cleaned and replanted the Mark Tubbs flagpole memorial garden. So the park is looking great!"

"We have met with Livingston County Development regarding private business interest at the former Save-a-Lot property. It's not a grocery store but we are in early discussion with them. There will be a Planning Board meeting on Wednesday 6-24-20 at 7pm to review the Pathstone Apartment Development. It will be online, detail on the village website." "The Village newsletter is on the website and is out with the water/sewer bills."

# To The Class of 2020

You live in strange times. You dream of greatness, of achievement, of success. Others have captured their dreams. You're no different from them. You can earn your desires. You either have a plan or you know you can make a plan, by yourself or through the aid of helpful allies.

But now, at this very moment, your life has been disturbed, uprooted by forces you cannot control. Your carefully crafted plans, your jubilant expectations, your equitable share, all have been stripped from you. Together, they represent a loss you can never regain.

You are not alone. Why do bad things happen to good people? This is a question long asked by theologians, pondered by philosophers, and analyzed by psychiatrists. Yet, for all the mental, physical, and financial resources devoted to solve its enigma, the query persists, as baldly – and boldly – unanswered as when it was first asked.

Do you find yourself asking this very same question?

You are not alone. For all the promise of the ideal, life remains fundamental unfair. It is nature's way. You find yourself caught up in a maelstrom of chaos. You can only wonder, "Why? Why me?"

You are not alone. Others share your experience – other peers, other generations, other eras. It is this mystery of life that inspired good and bad, everything from churches to cults to movements to revolutions.

It is a living rhythm that plays on forever. Each different group of

people see themselves as a unique chord. Successive generations can be heard as a progression of chords. Yet the theme endures as the music plays on.

I can't say I can answer the question for you. But I can offer you a way out. It's an escape route used by others in many places across many centuries.

First, know the demons surrounding you. Only by recognizing them can you elude them.

But it requires more than admitting they exist. It demands more than just seeing them. You must become them.

Now, don't get me wrong. I don't mean to perform evil acts. To paraphrase ancient Chinese military strategist Sun Tzu in *The Art of War*, you must step into the shoes of your enemy to outsmart him.

To defeat those opposed to you, you must know their every move. To know their every move, you must think like them. To think like them, you must feel the sum of their experiences. In other words, you must empathetically walk the same path they have walked.

There's another saying that captures this same sentiment: Only saints know more about sin than sinners.

Why is that so? It's not because saints must first commit a sin before they can become enlightened. No. It's because, by knowing sin, saints have identified a way out, a way to avoid sin, a way to live the ideal life – the life of their dreams.

Here's one of those demons

stalking you right now. It's the demon of boredom. It rips you of your dreams by tempting you to be complacent. It satisfies your immediate thirst only to rob you of the drink of long-term prosperity.

both ways.

If you treat it as an opportunity to explore, to build, to move one step closer to your lifetime dream, then grabbing control of each day is a useful strategy.

If, on the other hand, you use it as an excuse to "eat, drink, and be merry, for tomorrow you shall die," then you are allowing this single day to control you. Again, is this an epithet you seek? Do you want your tombstone to read: "Here lies Suzie. She traded the dream of her life for a single day?"

The demon does. And it's coming to get you. Every. Single. Day.

There's a way to throw rocks at those pesky demons, and *Carpe Diem* offers a useful hint: opportunity.

Stop reading this for a moment to consider what opportunity you can take advantage of right now.

... Are you back? Did you think of something?

... Rather than *carpe diem*, you should *carpe potestatem* ("seize the opportunity").

A better way of describing this productive tactic is *occupandi temporis* ("seize the moment"). Each moment is rife with opportunities. All it takes is an attentive ear, a watchful eye, and craving to connect dots in ways most people don't.

How does this work? It's easier than you can imagine

If life tells you to go to your room, go to your room. But once

you're there, take a paper and pencil (or your computer) and spend some time in solitary doing something you've never done because you never thought you had time to do it. Just because life is telling you to go to your room doesn't mean it's telling you what to do once you get there.

If life tells you to eat your vegetables, eat your vegetables. But mix them in a stir fry pan with spices and sauces so they taste like your favorite dish. Feel free to throw some meat or pasta on the platter. Just because life tells you to eat your vegetables doesn't mean it's also telling you not to eat meat or pasta.

If life tells you the store is closed, don't shop there. Shop online or at another store that's open. If they don't have your favorite brand, try a new one you've always wanted to try but that convenience and habit had prevented you from doing so. Just because life tells you your favorite store is closed doesn't mean you can't shop.

In each case, you're seizing the opportunity presented at that very moment. You're not idling away your time alone in your room. You're not moping at the kitchen table complaining about your vegetables. You're not throwing a tantrum because other stores are open but your favorite store is closed.

No. You're doing what you want to do. You're moving one tiny step closer to your lifetime dream.

After all, it is your dream.

Seize it.

Are you willing to sacrifice your future for a quick smile today? If so, you lose all rights to complain about where you are when your future comes upon you. Are you willing to cede control of your life? This demon voraciously desires that you will.

And here's when you're most vulnerable: that instant immediately after the completion of a big achievement. Maybe for you, that would be right now. If it is, watch out!

## HF-L Interact Club Inducts New Board

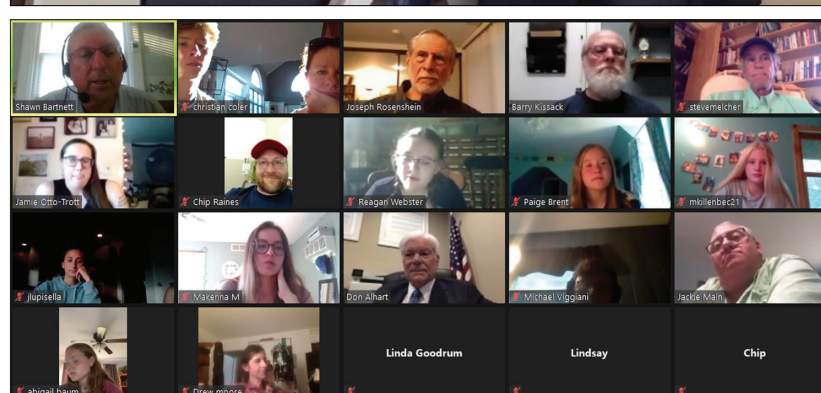

Among the things that she has missed over the last three months since COVID-19 closed school and forced learning online is being in class and her friends from the track team.

"I was disappointed because track season was about to start and I would have liked to see what our team could have done and also because I couldn't see friends and teachers," she said. "It made me realize how important school is. But, the quarantine also forced me to reach out to friends because I could not see them every day and it made me stay on task and work independently, which I will need to do at college."

Ackerman, the son of Kate and Dave Ackerman, will attend Cornell University with an intended major of mechanical engineering. He also considered Northeastern University, University of North Carolina, University of Virginia, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Duke University, Univer-

sity of Maryland, University of Wisconsin, Penn State and Dartmouth but was accepted through early decision at Cornell. He held an academic average of 97/98 while challenging himself with courses such as AP Physics 2, AP Computer Science, AP English Language and Composition, AP U.S. History, AP Chemistry, AP Statistics, AP Government, AP Calculus BC, AP Macroeconomics, AP Psychology and a microeconomics course online through Tompkins-Cortland Community College.

His involvement in school reached beyond academics to clubs and activities such as Link Crew as a junior, Model UN, STEM Club and National Honor Society for two years, serving as NHS President this past year.

As a junior, he placed 12<sup>th</sup> in the pole vault by soaring 11 feet, 6 inches at the Monroe County League Championship and fourth in the pole vault by clearing 12-3 at the Section V Class B Championship. He is not thinking of playing a sport in college.

The following is a brief update and information surrounding the Village of Honeoye Falls community. We hope that this update finds you well and beginning to be able to get out (safely) a little bit. > The Village Office is now open to (full time hours) Monday thru Friday (8:30 AM to 4:00 PM) Anyone that needs to visit the Village Office

must call ahead for an appointment and all visitors must wear a mask/face covering. If a visitor needs one, a mask will be provided. (The face mask policy will remain in effect indefinitely)


> Village board and committee meetings are now being completed in person (while social distancing), however residents or interested parties will need to view or participate via a live stream that will take place. Based upon agenda subject matter and potential "applicants" the board may allow specific parties to meet with the board while socially distancing. This policy is fluid and may change based upon conditions.

> We are hoping and planning to begin our summer concert series and will expect to have our fist concert in Harry Allen Park on June 30<sup>th</sup> beginning at 6:30 PM (weather permitting). Please plan to continue the practice of social distancing and wearing a mask as required.

Lastly, on Saturday, June 13<sup>th</sup>, a rally in support of the Black Lives Matter movement was held in the Village and at Harry Allen Park. It was heartwarming to see a very large group of community residents attend and listen, support, and talk about racial divide and the need to come together

their first #1 seed in the sport in 2019 en route to advancing to the semifinal round of the Section V Class D Tournament. She was named to the Section V Class D All-Tournament team. She won't play a sport at Liberty.

## Revisiting HF Cemetery – Part II – Summer 2020

### Iron Fireman Heroes

(October 6<sup>th</sup>, 2005)

Raise your gaze high for the month of October, at least when you are in the neighborhood of Honeoye Falls Village Hall.

Standing proudly over our town is Iron Fireman, actually Iron Fireman II, whose predecessor reigned for more than a century and withstood attacks on his person from fire departments near and far. [Ed: He was often referred to simply as "Iron Man," but I'll stick to the more colorful "Iron Fireman."]

Corrosion, not stealth, brought him down from a perch fashioned by one Michael Tucker, after being swiped from Avon in October 1891.

Mike and all the other principals in the story, captors and defenders alike, have passed to their final reward ages ago. Most are in the village cemetery, and rusty, old Iron Fireman has gone into a display case, safe from the elements.

HF Cemetery will be honoring those participants with a growing display of fire department flags. Starting next week, the men who were part of the first, albeit unsuccessful, midnight forage, October 21<sup>st</sup>, 1891, will have their gravesites flagged.

The following week, flags will be placed on the fellows who succeeded in absconding with Iron Fireman in the wee hours of October 29<sup>th</sup>.

In the third week, the largest group, those who protected and prevented dastardly neighboring fire companies from capturing Iron Fireman, will have flags placed upon their graves.

In November, and only if everyone pays homage to the heroes of this unique slice of Americana, News & Notes will reveal when an Iron Fireman was successfully stolen by rival fire laddies.

### Iron Fireman Heroes

(Part II)

(October 13<sup>th</sup>, 2005)

Relative to fire-fighting, the mid-1880s was a jolly time in the score or so years following the America's horrific Civil War.

Among other advances, handsome cemetery grounds were laid out and organized fire companies replaced the romantic, often ineffective, bucket brigade. In towns throughout the land, civic spirit entered its halcyon era.

The *Honeoye Falls Cemetery Association* (presently "Section B") was formed in 1866, and, in 1885, the *Honeoye Falls Volunteer Fire Department* came to be.

Wouldn't you know, several days later, the Village Hall and several neighboring structures burst into flames. The town was saved from its greatest conflagration by the courageous men of HFVFD, but the wooden hall (the former Methodist Church; converted and rolled into position) fell and was replaced by the handsome brick structure you see today.

The silver lining in all this is the perch balancing Iron Fireman, Honeoye Falls most prized possession, and nothing short of Fort Knox. Ever since this slice of sheet metal was fashioned into a symbol of heroism in St. Catherines, Ontario, he has been carried at annual firemen's conventions and coveted by fire companies.

It became great sport to steal him, secure his 125-pound figure to the fire hall steeple and spend sleepless nights protecting against theft by rival companies.

In late summer 1891, Avon managed to outwit Rochester's Protective Hose boys and abscond with Iron Fireman. Hearing of the exploit, our local boys were quick to their own scheme and, in the wee hours of October 20<sup>th</sup>, nine shadows rolled into the darkness toward Avon.

Brimming with spunk, but lacking a plan, the attackers were quickly betrayed, surrounded, given a heavy dose of 'razzberries,' and sent home.

Whether utterly embarrassed by failure or simply wishing more shut-eye and less fad activity, four men dropped out of the new plan to make another raid another night. Two of the four, George Vallance and A.J. Goheen, plus the wealthy Sylvester Wilcox, who supplied the getaway wagon, are interred in HF Cemetery.

Their graves are sporting fire department flags as you read this.

### Iron Fireman Heroes

(Part III)

(October 20<sup>th</sup>, 2005)

Some histories suggested it was a day after the bungled attack to pilfer Avon's Mr. Iron Fireman, but HF's "Knights of the Hose" needed more than twenty-four

hours to devise a deep-laid plan.

By October 27<sup>th</sup>, 1891, HFVFD spies, who'd lurked about Avon's streets in daylight, and schemers back at HF fire hall concocted a rational design to secure Iron Fireman. Pivotal were to scale Avon's downtown hose house; rope Iron Man; saw his securing rod; and deftly lower him to the waiting arms of compatriots below - all after stealthily entering the sleeping town.

Eleven men sallied forth over darkened dirt roads until, about 2 a.m. on the 28<sup>th</sup>, three of them were shaking hands with the famed iron fellow. All was going swimmingly, until Iron Fireman escaped his tether, clattered off the roof to the sidewalk below, arousing a sleeping beauty across the alley.

"Get up, they're stealing the iron man!" rang through the streets of Avon, the *Herald's* Editor Van Allen, came sweeping up in his white nightshirt and cap, only to startle many into thinking he was an apparition and turning a hose on him... while most of HF's men were making a bee-line for East Avon and home.

Fortunately for this story, they'd not forgotten to fling Iron Fireman into the back of the wagon before galloping off. Unfortunately, the three men on the roof were nabbed, relieved of their rope, ordered to church on Sunday, and forced to walk home.

Two of them, Lew Nickason and Byron Beach, are interred in HF Cemetery, while four of the other conspirators are buried there too - Fred Bronson, Will Nau, C.H. Park and Charles Pierce. Their graves are freshly sporting fire department flags to honor their accomplishment.

The aftermath of that seminal event in HF history is rip-roaring too. Read about those heroes in the next column.

### Iron Fireman Heroes

(Part IV)

(October 27<sup>th</sup>, 2005)

As the sun appeared on the autumn horizon of October 28<sup>th</sup>, 1891, a band of crazed hondre's thundered into Honeoye Falls - whooping and hollering. First thinking the liquor flowed later than usual the night before, bleary-eyed citizens arose to hear the grapevine news of Iron Fireman's capture from Avon town.

Excepting the fire department's 1885 founding and the great fire that took out the Village Hall the same year, and a when an 1888 gale blew down the weather vane from the new steeple, this was about the biggest news to hit town since it earned the condescending title of "Murderville" in the 1850's and '60's.

Of course, even several locals agreed with the *Avon Herald's* assessment that Iron Fireman histrionics comprised: "...the most senseless fad about which we have ever heard."

Nonetheless, many partook of the adventuresome fun. Included among them were; Dr. Dell Browne, who first designed the Iron Fireman for illustrative use in newspapers, and Joe Ebray, who, in 1927, bought Iron Fireman for \$1.47 at the firemen's fund-raising carnival - but never received value on his money.

Protecting Iron Fireman successfully, as perhaps a dozen other towns had failed to do, that became a point of local pride. It resulted in a tenure [nearly one hundred and thirty winters as of 2020] that has seen his likeness emblazoned on everything from fire trucks, to ash trays and beer mugs, to key fobs.

Along with Browne and Ebray, commemorative flags have been placed on the following cemetery plots of those who protected, promoted and sometimes got a bit disheveled in keeping foreign mitts off Iron Fireman: Asa Burton, Lew Hollister, Lyle Krieger, Jay Longfellow, Olin Rittenhouse, Harry O'Brien, 'Buck' Shirley, the Sleight boys (for their deft and daring upkeep of I. F.), Sheldon Smith, James Southgate and Homer Warner.

And then there's Merritt

Kimball, long-time fireman, village wag and, along with his beloved Jeanette, #1 fans of the great 'Husky Farmers' semi-pro baseball team. Together almost to the end (they died a week apart in 1994). Their grave marker (Chase B, M32) is unique, as it is the only one bearing the logo of storied Iron Fireman.

## IRON FIREMAN STOLEN! DESPOILED OF THE IRON TROPHY!

(November 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2005)

It had to happen some time.

One September night in 1963, an Iron Fireman, dressed in colorful fire-fighting regalia and looked upon with covetous eyes since the 1880's, was abducted by nighttime raiders. The proud symbol of the community was kidnapped - plain and simple.

Someone pulled it off, without a cry of alarm or a fire whistle blaring. In fact, the theft was not discovered until daybreak revealed the dastardly deed.

Sure, he stood alone, protecting a sleeping town, but pilfered right under residents' noses! Wasn't the constabulary watching his perch?? And where were the smug fire fighters, who claimed it couldn't be done??!

Just to show it could be done, the rival fire company proudly displayed Iron Fireman in front of their hall - **for one day** - then allowed it to be taken back! With great effort (which made the kidnapping all the more amazing) the Iron Fireman was returned to the perch he'd occupied for many years.

Is this a dubious tale? Would Mr. News & Notes lie to you? It happened and the writer has documented proof.

You may then ask: "Since it's been shown it can be stolen, doesn't it tarnish the image of all those firemen's flags in Honeoye Falls Cemetery?"

"Goodness no," is my retort, "in due time, future pages of the *Sentinel* will reveal why."

## Life with the (Word) Smiths

### WENDING OUR WAY WEST TO WHEATLAND: WHEATLAND CENTER

**RESET** - We'll continue our tribute to Wheatland this week by hitting the heart of the town, Wheatland Center. The hamlet of Wheatland Center definitely has some standout storylines.

At the beginning of the 20<sup>th</sup> century when some of the other bygone hamlets had already begun their fade into obscurity, Wheatland Center was enjoying a rejuvenation due to a couple unique developments. They had figured out a way to efficiently grow mushrooms in caves and they were shipping out thousands of tons of Black Death a year. If you're dying to hear the details of these deadly stories read on.

**EARLY DAYS** - Moving from Seneca County in 1799, Englishman Francis Albright became Wheatland Center's first settler. The following batch of settlers were all Scots, led by John McNaughton, who were connected to the area by "land agent" Charles Williamson. That period in history included the concept of land agents whose job it was to entice new immigrants to occupy, and then own, available land spreading out to the west.

In 1804 Francis Albright built a gristmill on the south side of Oatka Creek, which was the first mill on the Creek. Prior to this time, settlers had to haul their grain into Indian Allan's mill at High Falls in Rochester or crush it by hand with a mortar and pestle. While Albright's mill might have been crude, it was still preferable to the High Falls hike or the personal pestle process.

The aforementioned John McNaughton rose to prominence in Wheatland Center. His prosperous farm was located just west of the hamlet. He became the first grain dealer in Wheatland, shipping wheat to Canada before 1812. And you know how those Scots love scotch. McNaughton built the first distillery in Wheatland, on Oatka Creek just west of his home.

**CLARK HALL** - The next man to make a momentous emergence was Clark Hall, who arrived in Wheatland Center in 1820 and opened up the hamlet's first general store. Spurred on by the success of this store, in 1825 Hall opened the first tavern in town on the southwest corner of the crossroads of Wheatland Center and Scottsville-Mumford Roads. The success of the tavern enabled Clark to establish his location as a stagecoach stop.

In 1826 the U.S. postal service came to town and Hall was successful in establishing himself as postmaster and having the post office installed in his tavern. For obviously solid reasons, from 1826 until the 1840's the hamlet was called Hall's Corners.

If Wheatland Center/Hall's Corners were a Monopoly game, Clark Hall would clearly be winning at this point. The next property he acquired would be the Albright gristmill which he bought in 1832. Hall's next move was in the mid-1830's when he led a group which obtained a charter to construct a railroad from Scottsville to LeRoy.

That railroad approached Wheatland Center from the east and was open to Mumford in 1837 and Caledonia in 1838. The tracks ran parallel to where the Rochester and Sutherland tracks run today. It was hoped that the railroad would attract industry, but that hope did not pan out and the railroad eventually failed.

**HIRAM SMITH** - The next big name to emerge in the Wheatland

Center story was Hiram Smith. In 1844 he bought the gristmill from Clark Hall and completely remodeled and improved the machinery, reinventing the company as Genesee Flour. This revamped venture proved extremely successful serving wide markets in both Boston and New York. Genesee Flour actually flourished to the point where Hall needed to expand his operation with the purchase and/or construction of a total of six mills.

Smith's success continued until 1855 when "the wet summer" decimated Wheatland's wheat crop. The following three summers suffered from the affliction of the wheat midge, an invasive insect which attacked the wheat crop. With six mills basing their work upon a devastated crop, Genesee Flour obviously suffered setbacks.

**HAMLET CLOSINGS** - Similar setbacks subsequently surfaced in the entire hamlet of Wheatland Center. In 1858 the post office was dismissively discontinued, and other dominoes of destiny continued to fall. The tavern that was in the same building closed shortly thereafter. Obviously, the post office / tavern combo was dear to the hearts of the Wheatland Center residents and we can see where they're coming from.

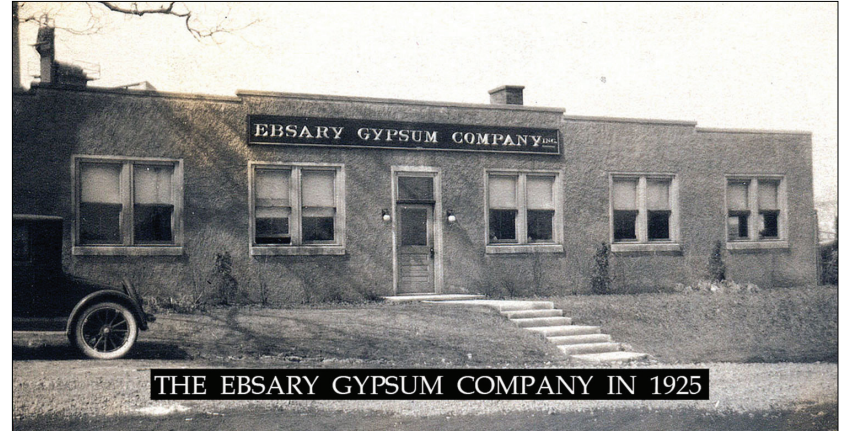
Why would you want to go pick up your mail, if you couldn't have a drink if the news was good? You

know how the U.S. post office has been losing money for decades and the cost of stamps continues to increase astronomically? Well, here's Wheatland Center's 19<sup>th</sup> century suggestion to the 21<sup>st</sup> century post office. If every post office opened up an adjacent bar, our formula indicates that tips alone could cut the cost of postage stamps in half.

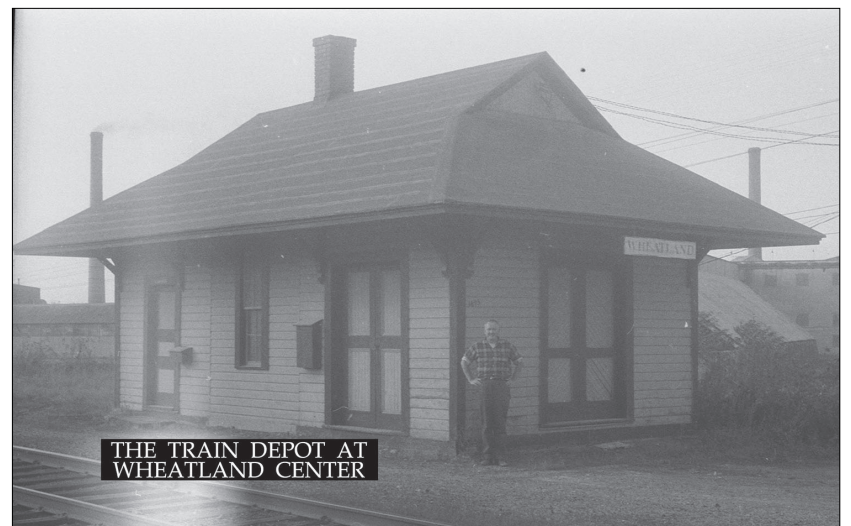
As with all the bygone Wheatland hamlets, the second half of the 19<sup>th</sup> century does see a decline, which we will share with you, but keep in mind we still have in our back pocket the teaser we shared with you in the opening paragraph of this piece. Wheatland Center will not succumb before growing cavernous mushrooms and selling thousands of tons of Black Death. Before broaching those storylines please allow us to share the following late-1800's highlights.

The Hiram Smith component of the Wheatland Center story burned down in 1875 along with his mill. At that point Smith bought another mill in Honeoye Falls and moved his business there. In 1887 W.D. Strobel, who was already operating a woolen mill in Mumford, had become so prosperous that he bought the site of the old Hiram Smith mill and used it to install a large new cloth mill called "Trout Brook Woolen Mill #2".

The clothing made at this mill was in nationwide demand. The market

spanned the country from Boston to New York to Chicago to San Francisco. For whatever reasons that success was destined to become fairly short term. Trout Brook Woolen Mill #2 was closed by the end of the century.

**CHURCH, SCHOOL, TAVERN** - As opposed to some of the other Wheatland hamlets, Wheatland Center never had a church. Clark Hall opened Wheatland Center's first tavern and inn in 1825. This establishment changed hands a few times before closing in 1858.

Regarding the school buildings, in the early 1830's a two-story brick building was erected as a private academy, but it was only open for three or four years. A framed schoolhouse was built in the late 1830's which was replaced by another framed schoolhouse built in 1846. That building on Wheatland Center Road served the community for over a century until it was closed in 1948 when the students were sent to Caledonia.

**GYPSUM / PLASTER BUSINESS** - Mining gypsum, with uses including plaster, concrete and dry wall, became the focal point in the Wheatland Center economy being in the early 1890's. By 1905 there were seven companies engaged in the mining or manufacturing of gypsum. Production continued throughout the 20<sup>th</sup> century with the final company involved, the Ebsary Gypsum Company toiling in this endeavor until it closed in 1954. That plant is currently occupied by the Sabin Metal Company.

**THE MUSHROOM STORY** - While the mining of gypsum was an

important component in 19<sup>th</sup> century Wheatland, once the mines had been fully tapped, they inadvertently led to an unexpected financial boon in Wheatland Center. In the early 1900's it was discovered that gypsum mines possess certain natural advantages for the growing of mushrooms.

In the abandoned mine tunnels, frames were built that could hold 6 inches of compost which would be covered with mushroom spawn and finally covered with an inch of sand. In 1904 the Wheatland Cave Mushroom Company was formed and these folks rented the unused mine tunnels from the plaster company. Through this means, Wheatland Center was able to grow 80 pounds of mushrooms a week. Thatsa lotta 'shrooms!

**BLACK DEATH** - Following up with the second half of our teaser lines from earlier in the article, we will next satisfy your curiosity about how the economy of Wheatland Center was totally rejuvenated by the sale of thousands of tons of Black Death. It was the Wheatland Land Plaster Company which was behind this deadly initiative.

Turns out plaster is also a primary ingredient in some insecticides. Black Death bug poison became a major source of income for the plaster company. Their insecticide was in great demand in the agricultural states of the Midwest. Apparently if you're a potato bug, Black Death is really bad news.
