Our local Towns, Villages and Hamlets have all been adorned in festive fashion for the upcoming celebrations. The holiday season has arrived in Sentinel-land. LET'S GET DECORATIVE - We'd like to bring everybody into the loop on the multiple activities available during this season's holiday in Honeoye Falls. Let's lead with something that's new this year. The Village of Honeoye Falls and Honeoye Falls-Mendon Rotary Club are proud to be sponsoring the 1st Annual Village Business Holiday Decorating Contest. The goal is to have businesses "Help us Light up the Village Business District and Celebrate the Spirit of the Season."

So if you notice some extra decorations in HF this year, they may well have been inspired by the collaborative efforts of the Village and Rotary Club. The winners will be announced on December 10th after the annual Honeoye Falls Fire Department Christmas Parade. PARADE PARTICULARS - Moving on to the parade, the lining-up process begins at 5:00 on both sides of West Main Street up by the Market Place. Starting time is set for 6:00 sharp and you should expect to see the street fully lined all the way to the 4 corners. Next, we'll share some HFFD stats from past and present.

Amongst the anticipated crowd of about a thousand, expect to see many children in their high-anticipation mode, anxious to find themselves on the receiving end of 200 pounds of candy donated by Rotary Club. What will all of these onlookers witness as the parade proceeds before them? Look to see about 15-20 local fire companies, and approximately 25-30 overall floats, contributing to the festive holiday ambiance. The cherry on top is always the final Rotary float with Santa officially waving in the Christmas season to Honeoye Falls.

involved on some level the Village Hall has begun the collection of non-perishable food items. Contributions will be accepted through December 19th when the village will donate everything that has been collected to F.I.S.H., our local food pantry. ROTARY ROUNDUP - HF-Mendon Rotary Club is also very involved in the charitable Christmas initiative on multiple levels. We had the opportunity to speak with Club President Sheldon Boyce who shared some of the details. One project they undertake is to provide and deliver Christmas trees to needy families in the community. Sheldon shared that he considered this his "favorite Rotary service project."

He told us some great stories about how impactful these efforts have been. He's been doing this for two decades now and particularly poignant are

memories of making these deliveries with his own kids when they were younger. As they would drive up to the homes of the beneficiaries, he would hear the children gleefully shouting, "Mommy, Mommy, the Christmas tree's here!"

BREAKFAST WITH THE BIG GUY - Rotary also collaborates with Flaherty's to offer their annual "Breakfast with Santa" to the community. Flaherty's donates all the food for the event with Rotary also contributing with a donut run to the Market Place.

This year that event will be held on Saturday morning December 17th and Flaherty's manager Lindsay Creager told us that service will begin at 9:00 with Santa's arrival scheduled for 10:00. Don't tell the kids, but Santa bears a striking resemblance to local

Voters To Weigh In On \$40.2 Million Dollar HF-L Capital Project

The voters in the Honeoye Falls-Lima Central School District will be making the final decision on a potential \$40,294,070 capital project, the third phase of a multi-year plan that the district began several years ago.

Voters will head to the polls to vote on the proposed project on Tuesday, December 13 from 9 a.m.-9 p.m. at the Board of Education room in the high school building.

Of the \$40 million-plus project, the vast majority of that money is earmarked for the high school (\$23,348,265 worth). The proposal contains renovations for the B-wing science classrooms, renovations to the B-wing second and third floor classrooms and hallways, improvements to the B-wing gym, including wall pads, scoreboards, basketball backboards, the gym divider, its ceiling and floor, renovations to the high school auditorium (sound, stage and house lighting, seating and finishes to the stage floor and steps as well as pit infill), renovations to the high school kitchen as well as the district's business office and human resources office, improvements to the pool (including its deck, gutters, filtration and drain covers, diving board and starting blocks), boys and girls locker room renovations by the A-wing gym, renovations to the second floor wrestling room/auxiliary gym located above some of the locker rooms and A-wing physical education offices as well as elevator access to that second

floor area, roof reconstruction over the B-wing (the original part of the high school) and the A-wing gym and second floor classrooms and library, window replacement in the original high school building, some interior/exterior door replacement, masonry restoration, pool and fitness center HVAC improvements and piping and drinking fountain replacement, public address notification system and renovations to some bathrooms.

The next highest total will be spent at the Middle School (\$7,592,888). Those repairs feature improvements to the bleachers, wall pads, divider, sound and projection systems and floor refinishing at the school's gym, renovations to science classroom 511, replacement of the boiler plant, generator and fire pump, replacement of classroom unit ventilator, improvements to some bathrooms which includes sanitary piping replacement, the school's public address notification system, paving of the north and south parking lots, and some sidewalk and exterior lighting replacement.

Lima Primary is slated to receive \$5,817,390 in the proposal. That features renovations to the school's kitchen/cafeteria area and faculty room, renovations to some classrooms, roof reconstruction over the kindergarten wing, window replacement in the 1930s portion of the school, some exterior door replacement, HVAC controls upgrades and domestic water

legend Tracy Main whose annual efforts should certainly be acknowledged. We have more on Tracy later in this article.

Rotary President-Elect Amy Harris, said, "We do not charge for the event, but ask participants to bring food to donate to the local pantry and collect monetary donations to support polio eradication and local Rotary initiatives such as the tree donation, school lunches and more."

**INTERACT INITIATIVE** - For this event Rotary also recruits the assistance of its satellite high school organization, Interact Club. If you're not familiar with it, the concept of Interact Club was initiated in 1962 with the purpose of instilling in high school students the Rotary mission statement values of "Service above Self." **SENECA FALLS SOJOURN** - This one goes back five years when we were blessed with some of the craziest Christmas karma this couple has ever commemorated. ## SMITHS' LISTS: Colorful Idioms & Expressions White Knights Tell White Lies On White Elephants



### From White Elephants To White Whales

In our never-ending efforts to be the colorful couple you've all come to know and love, we have put together a Smiths' Lists series in which we will delve into idioms and phrases having to do with various colors. And for the record, the definition of an idiom is an expression or phrase which takes on a meaning other than what the words would appear to mean on the surface.

We're not going to "beat around the bush" or "cut corners;" we'll just give you some examples you can "wrap your head around." If you're "feeling under the weather" when "it's raining cats and dogs," don't get "bent out of shape." So, there you have a flurry of wordplay exemplifying the concept of the idiom.

This week we're calling for a full-blown white out. When you see our "white knight" ride in on his "white elephant" you'll certainly be ready to "wave the white flag." If we were to tell you that we're "as white as the driven snow" that might be a bit of a "white lie." We're on this one like "white on rice" and we'll get musical with the story on "White Christmas" as well as sharing some other white musical highlights.

**WHITE ELEPHANT** - Something that appears magnificent, but is actually more trouble than it's worth, is what's known as a white elephant. The idiom dates back to 1800's Siam (now Thailand) where elephants were, and still are, a national symbol. The rarest of all pachyderms is the albino elephant so in one sense they became the most treasured animal in the kingdom, but you probably don't have to be Nostradamus to see the perilous paradox looming over the elephant's litter box on this one.

Sure, if you were the owner of a beautiful awe-inspiring beast such as a white elephant, you'd certainly be blessed with the neighborhood's greatest conversation starter. But what about that 300 pounds of food and 50 gallons of water that your animal requires each day? And the feeding and watering would actually be the more pleasant of the two tasks incumbent with the care of your elephant.

If 300 pounds are going in, guess how much of that is coming out the other end? Yep, you're looking at 100-125 pounds of sh\*t-shoveling. Let's face it; after all that shoveling, you're going to be in no mood to entertain the neighbors. All of which leads us back to the original premise of the idiom and the question which we're left to ponder. Is the grandeur of owning a white elephant worth the effort to care for it?

**WHITE KNIGHT** - The earliest English reference to a White Knight

referred to Sir Lancelot in the Arthurian (King Arthur) legends from the first millennium. Even if your degree in Dark Ages English literature has expired, you probably would remember that Sir Lancelot was the ultimate good guy, noble knight, and horseback hero. Therefore the generalized definition of a White Knight would be a symbolic hero.

**WHITE LIE** - A white lie is a mistruth that is told, free from malignant intent, for the purpose of protecting someone's feelings or avoiding a harsher truth. The origins of this one go back quite a ways. Here is our language's first documented usage.

A 14th century letter quoted in the *Oxford English Dictionary* reads, "I do assure you he is unsuspected of any untruth or other notable crime (except a *white lye*) wiche is taken for a Small fawte in thes partes." (Translation: I do assure you he is not suspected of any untruth or other notable crime, except a white lie, which is taken as a small fault in these parts.)

**WHITED SEPULCHER** - We'll be going biblical on this one. Whited sepulchers are people or groups who manage to appear virtuous on the outside but inwardly they are wicked and corrupt. It is Jesus himself who first turns the phrase in Matthew 23:27. Here Jesus says, "Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye are like unto whited sepulchers, which indeed appear beautiful outward, but are within full of dead men's bones, and of all uncleanness." The Pharisees were a sect of traditional religious leaders who Jesus was calling out for not practicing what they preached.

**WHITE WHALE** - If you have a white whale that is not a good thing. One aspect of this idiom, which is nice however, is that it can be traced to a very specific and singular source. And that source would be Herman Melville's 1851 novel *Moby Dick*. In the storyline Captain Ahab is so obsessed with killing the white whale that he ends up allowing the whale to kill him.

The generalized meaning to be idiomatically extracted from this plot could be summarized as follows. A white whale is when a person becomes so obsessed with a particular object or goal that the obsession ultimately leads to that person's demise. The person allows the white whale to define and dominate their life so much that they compromise their health and/or safety, despite having little or no chance of success.

# How To Steal An Election (And Get Away With It)

Allow me to disclaim the following up front: I do not condone the stealing of elections. I believe every voter should be given a fair opportunity to vote and that every vote should count. I also don't condone shoplifting.

Now, back to reality. First you must recognize that national politics is no longer about doing good. It's simply a business.

There's no other way to describe it. When that much money is involved, and people have figured out a way to profit from all that money, well, that's the very definition of a business.

There's a word for those who seek to do good through running for public office. We call them "losers."

It's very rare for someone with no pecuniary interest in the office to win. Those with purely altruistic intentions most often see their ideals conflicting with the business demands of marketing a successful campaign.

And that's what a political campaign is: marketing.

Don't take my word for it. Listen to what the Simon School professors told me. You see, the capstone project for anyone seeking to earn an MBA was to create a virtual business and design a strategy to increase revenues and maximize profits.

Now, mind you, this was back when a "virtual business" meant a purely fictitious enterprise. There was no internet back then. Today, a virtual business means one operating within the virtual world of the internet.

Said another way, our capstone project was to imagine a theoretical business on paper, then build a profitable business plan for it. This is the essence of entrepreneurship. This was the spirit of the 80s, which apparently hadn't yet withered away in 1991 when I was awarded my MBA degree.

Here's the nut. I didn't want to waste my time creating a

theoretically profitable business. By the time my capstone project was to start in my final term, I had already created profitable businesses in real life.

No, I wanted a challenge. I wanted to take those business and marketing skills (my concentration was Finance and Marketing) and do something more creative, something truly outside the box, something I had never done before.

I recalled something I learned as an undergraduate student more than a decade earlier. The political science professor teaching the class I took lamented over the demise of political parties. He surmised the cause was the rise of the political entrepreneur – candidates who ran and won not on the basis of their political experience, but because they were well known in some other arena.

These celebrity candidates spawned from Hollywood, professional sports, and even NASA. This professor did not consider them worthy of serving high public office (like in the House of Representatives, the Senate, and especially the White House).

Perhaps he had forgotten that our Founding Fathers were not professional politicians. Nor did they expect their successors to make politics a career. Indeed, George Washington – The Father of Our Country – famously proclaimed his disdain for political parties in his Farewell Address:

"...designing men may endeavour to excite a belief that there is a real difference of local interests and views. One of the expedients of party to acquire influence, within particular districts, is to misrepresent the opinions & aims of other Districts. You cannot shield yourselves too much against the

jealousies and heart burnings which spring from these misrepresentations. They tend to render alien to each other those who ought to be

bound together by fraternal affection. The Inhabitants of our Western country have lately had a useful lesson on this head.”

I need not remind you that George Washington was a farmer and a soldier, not a professional politician.

In many ways, however, he was the ultimate entrepreneur – the self-made man.

With this in mind, I proposed to my professors, rather than designing a theoretical business engineered to maximize theoretical revenues, I offered to design a theoretical political campaign engineered to maximize theoretical votes. When they heard this, there was an audible pregnant pause in the room.

At first, I thought they were going to throw me out. No one had ever proposed such a radical idea. But, despite being one of the top business schools in the nation, it was still a graduate school. Such venues tend to embrace radical ideas. And mine was no exception.

“Chris,” they said, “this is a great project. It is the ultimate sales and marketing project. The candidate is the product. The voters are the customers. The election winner is the one who not only makes the best selling points, but delivers them in the most efficient and effective way. We're excited to see what you come up with.”

What I came up with not only earned an “A” and stamped the official seal on my degree, it

also became the blueprint for two successful political campaigns over the next six months.

So, if you see politics as a business, you're more likely to win.

Before I go any further, I should disclose that the real business of politics wasn't for the position I won – Mendon Town Board. There's not a lot of money involved at the local level. When you get to the state and Federal level, however, well, you can read the headlines as much as I can.

Those races exhibit the same cutthroat nature you find in the most competitive businesses. Indeed, go back and reread what George Washington said. Does that sound like he's describing what's happening today?

When you're playing to win, you do everything possible to leave the battlefield victorious. You use every sales and marketing trick in the book.

Which is where we get to how to “steal” an election. I put the word “steal” in quotes because the first thing you do is engineer the election rules to your advantage. If, for example, you aren't as good as your opponent at bringing your voters out on Election Day, you change the rules to extend Election Day to a week or even a month. That takes away your opponent's advantage.

It also gives you an opportunity to steal more votes. Here's how.

Let's say, on any particular day, you can successfully sneak in 100 more votes without anyone noticing. If you're limited to just one day (Election Day), you only end up with 100 votes. But if you can get voting extended a week, that's 700 more votes, and if a month, that's 3,000 more votes.

You see how that works? It's like shoplifting. You'll never get out the door if you steal a big item all at once. You can, however, steal the same value of goods if you sneak

out just a little each day. The only difference between shoplifting and stealing an election is that in the former you're illicitly taking out and in the latter you're illicitly adding in.

Another rule you'd want to change is how the votes are counted. If your allies control the voting process, you'd want the votes counted in one centralized location. It's a lot easier to hide any shenanigans from your opponents if there's only one place where the votes are revealed.

Back in the day when I ran for office, every election district was manned by members of different parties. That makes it harder for anything untoward to occur at the voting booths. It's the same way today.

What's different is how the votes are counted. When I ran, representatives from both parties observed the official tally within each voting district. That way, each party could add the numbers up from all the districts and see what the final vote was. As a result, you had three different groups adding up the numbers. Though only one was official, it was nearly impossible to sneak in illicit votes.

New York State doesn't do that anymore. All the votes go to one common collection point.

It's easier today than ever to steal an election. And, like in any cutthroat business, if you want access to the largess of public funds, there is no excuse for not winning.

You do what you have to do. Nothing personal. It's strictly business.

So, if you're a political party and a political candidate living in this political reality, don't just complain about the rules being “unfair” and demand a change. Use those same rules to your benefit. Only when the other party sees how the rules can be used against them will there be a consensus to stop the steal.

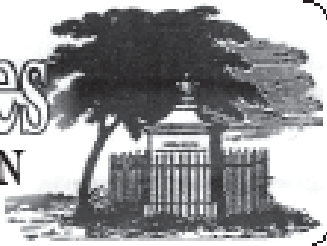

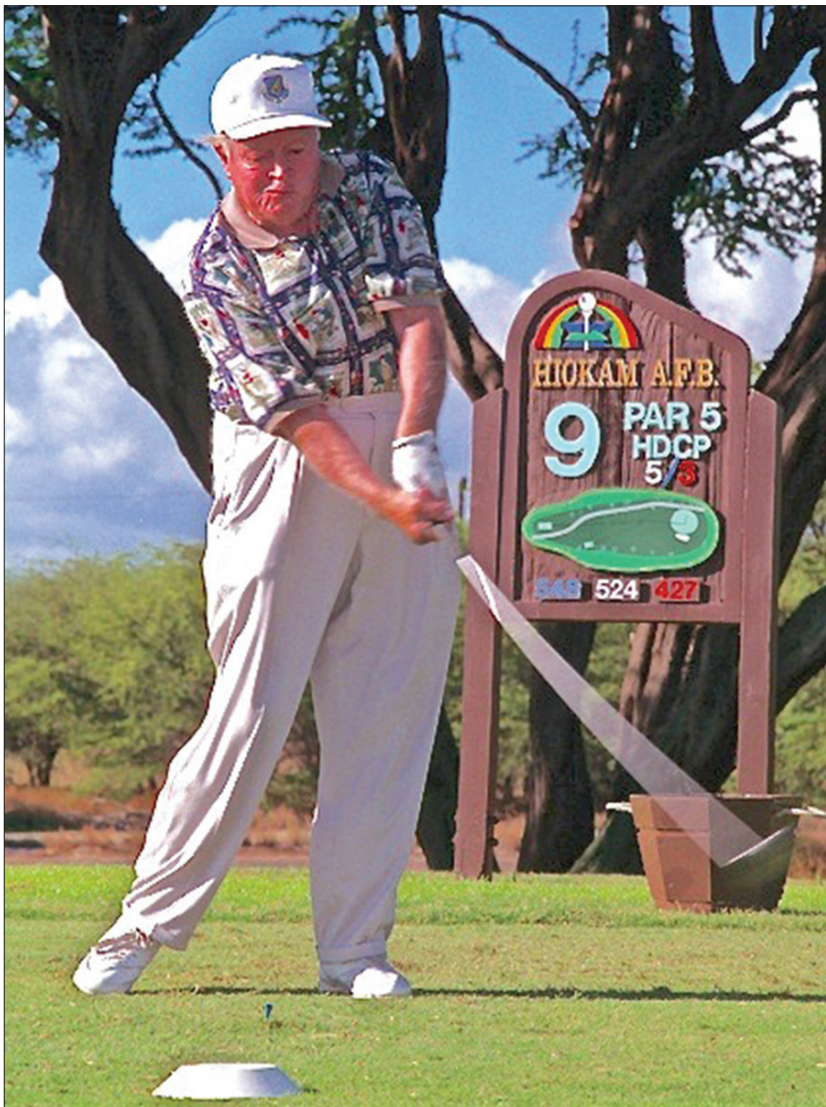

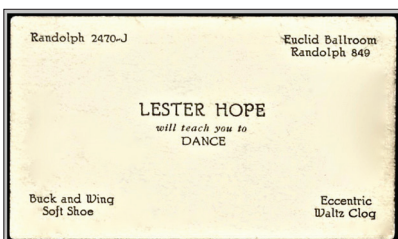
## Bob Hope, Cleveland's #1 Baseball Fan... no joke!

*Bob Hope Theatre*, in Eltham, England, the community of his birth in 1903, exists in as a tribute to Bob's altruism. Having left for America when he was five, he could barely identify with the place or its people. However, in the late '70s, when a call of financial distress threatened the *Eltham Little Theatre Company* (formed in 1943), the man of monumental influence resorted to his fledgling golf tournament, the *Bob Hope British Classic*, to help raise funds. To assure financial stability, he also put on a benefit show at the famous *London Paladium*... thus, the restored theatre was named in Hope's honor. It is healthy and vibrant today.



To Bob Hope, golf was his first recreational passion, which he actively pursued well into his nineties. Shown here in 1995 on Mamala Bay Golf Course at Hickam Air Force Base (target of Japan's surprise attack on Pearl Harbor in 1941), he estimated he'd played 1,000 to 1,500 golf courses from Greenland to Brazil. Though Bob's been gone nearly twenty years, to many players and fans his name remains synonymous with golf.

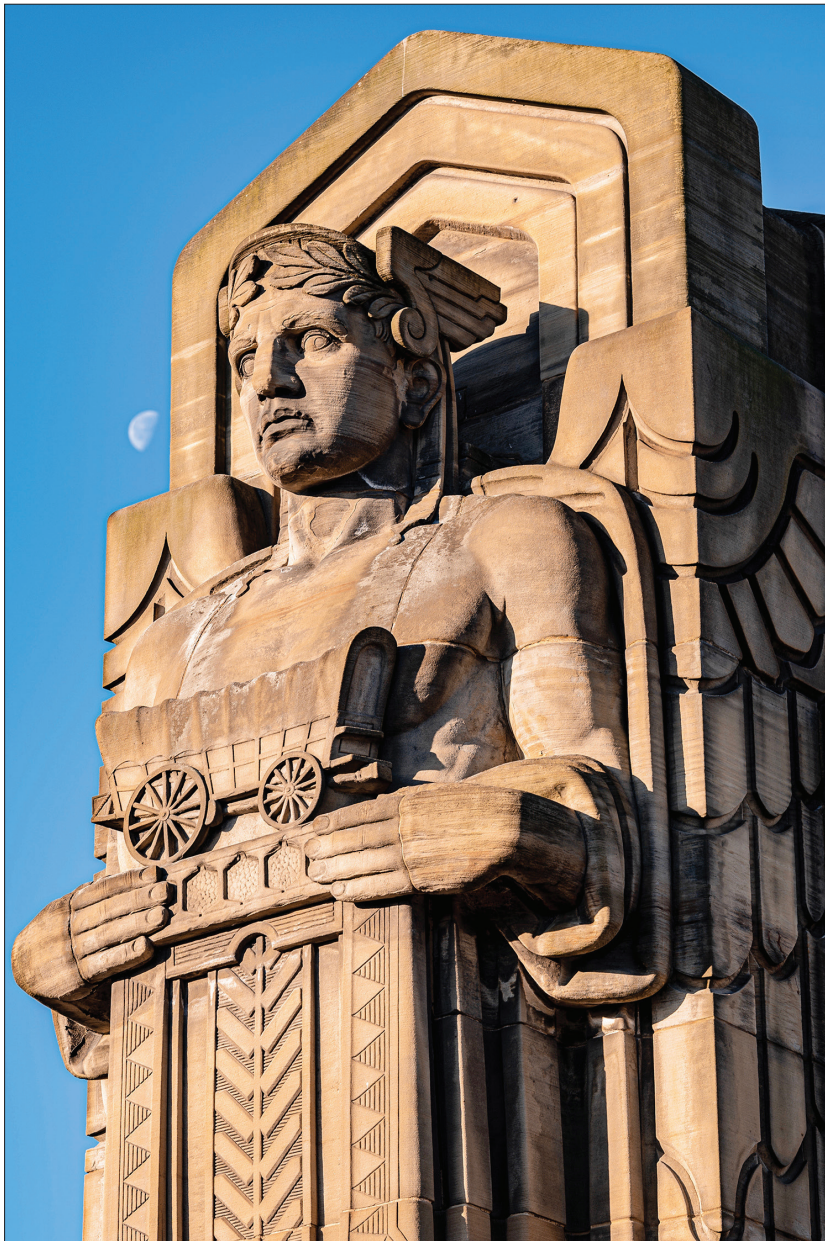


The large Hope family (his parents and six brothers) emigrated to Cleveland, at the time a vibrant industrial city. Striving for a broad base of cultures, while seeking the tourist dollar, too, Cleveland was booming in population. Years later, using comedy as his forte, he would quip: "I left England because I knew there was very little chance of me becoming king."

Lester (yet to identify as "Bob," when he tired of being called "Hopeless") wore many hats during his formative years... hawking newspapers, as a pool shark, a boxer (ring rats knew him as "Packy East"), a dance instructor and, for over a dozen years, doing great Charlie Chaplin imitations as a vaudevillian performer.

With the rise of talking pictures and radio during the 1930s, the latent talents that evolved on stage served him well.

Bob Hope's father, being an Old-World mason, was employed on the 1931 creation of the "Guardians of Traffic," four towering pylons with Art Deco figures decorating the Lorain-Carnegie Bridge into Cleveland. In the words of Henry Hering, in *Ohio Outdoor Sculpture*: "Each figure holds a different ground vehicle: a hay wagon, covered wagon, stage coach, passenger car, dump truck, concrete mixer, and two other trucks. The progression of vehicles from hay wagon to semi truck symbolizes the evolution of transport and the breadth of their protection."

In 1983, after being closed for several years, the bridge was extensively repaired and reopened as the "Hope Memorial Bridge," in honor of Bob Hope and his stonemason father. Ten years later, *Progressive Field*, the home of the Cleveland Guardians (nee "Indians") was constructed nearby.

This year, the team was given that new, and very appropriate nickname. I think Bob Hope, who loved his "Indians" dearly, would have approved.

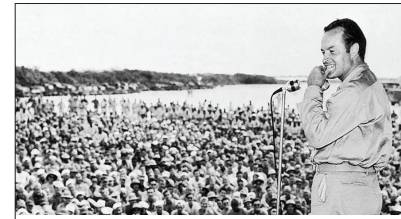

Upon the opening of *Progressive Field* in 1993, Cleveland's *Municipal Stadium* (which remained the home of the football "Browns" for a time) was eventually razed. Considered a beautiful piece of architecture when opened in 1932, the cavernous stadium, capable of holding nearly 90,000 people, witnessed a long list of sports highlights.

Of note is that Mel Harder was the pitcher of record on the day it opened, and sixty-one years later, he threw out the final pitch for the last game the ballclub played there. Young movie starlet, Shirley Temple, sang the national anthem that opening day and, wouldn't you know, the elderly Bob Hope highlighted its final game with "Thanks for the Memory"... his signature tune, first crooned in "The Big Broadcast of 1938," when he emerged as a major movie star.

Along with golf and comedy, Mr. Hope's other major foray into immortality was in inspiring the popularity of the United Service Organization (USO) Tours. He spearheaded the first one...displayed time and again absolute fearlessness in moving into and out of war zones...and, from May 6<sup>th</sup>, 1941, months before Pearl Harbor, into his nineties in the '90s, he remained committed to entertaining our nation's military men and women.

Throughout WWII, Korea, Vietnam and the Middle East conflict his troupe would, according to one source, "show up at military installations, usually with a group of beautiful Hollywood starlets, who danced across stages for wide-eyed soldiers, sailors, Marines, airmen, and Coast Guardsmen. 'I brought a little bit of home with me,' Hope would say introducing the women to the hollers of the men."

Even in peacetime, it was a good bet that Bob Hope was "usually missing Christmas Day in his own home."

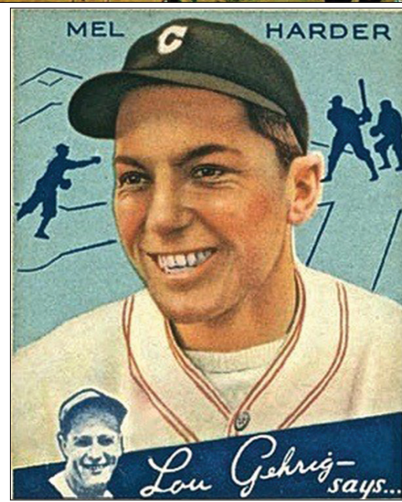

"O. K. So what's the big deal about Bob Hope and baseball?" you ponder. Some vignettes present Bing Crosby and Bob Hope, two baseball nuts along with being famous film stars, hamming it up in Pittsburgh and Cleveland uniforms... like they own the teams or something.

Well, they did, at least as part owners. In the early '40s, riding the success of their budding movie careers, Bing became a *Pirates* stockholder... which prompted Bob to buy a bit of the *Indians*.

For years thereafter, the boys were ever on the lookout for a comedic opportunity... in their baseball unis! They even produced a hilarious Paramount skit that often preceded main features in movie houses... "Baseball's Bustin' Out All Over." Having a game of catch, the one-liners came with every 'pitch'. Check out [youtube.com](https://www.youtube.com) if you doubt me.

One never knew what part-owner Hope might do during his stock-holding years. At the *Indians'* 1949 Spring Training camp in Tucson, Arizona, the mood changed, when Bob appeared with a bat fit for Goliath, taking a swing as if David was pitching.

In the October 1<sup>st</sup>, 1956 episode of *"I Love Lucy,"* Hope made a guest appearance when Lucy, the Mertzes, and Little Ricky attended a *Yankees-Indians* game at *Yankee Stadium*. Lucy, angling to get Bob to perform at her husband's nightclub, impersonates legendary *Indians* pitcher, Bob Feller. Long story short, they performed the ditty, *"Nobody Loves The Ump,"* buoyed by uproarious guffawing.

On the cover of the June 3<sup>rd</sup>, 1963 issue of *Sport's Illustrated*, dressed in full Cleveland *Indians* regalia, Bob was the subject of writer, Jack Olsen's article. In small measure, Olsen quipped: *"He is the kind of sports nut who will interrupt a visit to New Orleans to fly to Cincinnati to play a round of golf with some cronies... He seldom misses a big fight, even if he has to rush over to the Pantages Theater in Hollywood to see it on theater TV."*

The last game at Cleveland *Municipal Stadium* transpired on October 4<sup>th</sup>, 1993. To book-end the life of the ballpark, Miss Shirley Temple, who sang at the opener in 1932, was echoed by Bob Hope's rendition of *"Thanks for the Memory."* And the great Cleveland pitcher, Mel Harder, who fashioned two baseball careers of 20+ years as both player and coach (but has been overlooked by the Cooperstown Hall of Fame), was there to deliver the first pitch of the final game.

### Closing Remarks

In regarding the subject of Bob Hope, there are volumes of material that paint out the portrait of the man. Even researching him has been exhausting. Insists *The Guinness Book of World Records*, Bob holds the title as *"the most honored entertainer in the world."* [To the writer, he was also Cleveland's most enthusiastic and life-long baseball fan.]

Should anyone out there wish to debunk that accolade, set aside plenty of research time, for up to 1995, he received more than two thousand awards, including fifty-four honorary doctorate degrees. To reciprocate, Bob and Delores Hope donated much of his personal collection of papers, including about 90,000 jokes, to the *Library of Congress*.

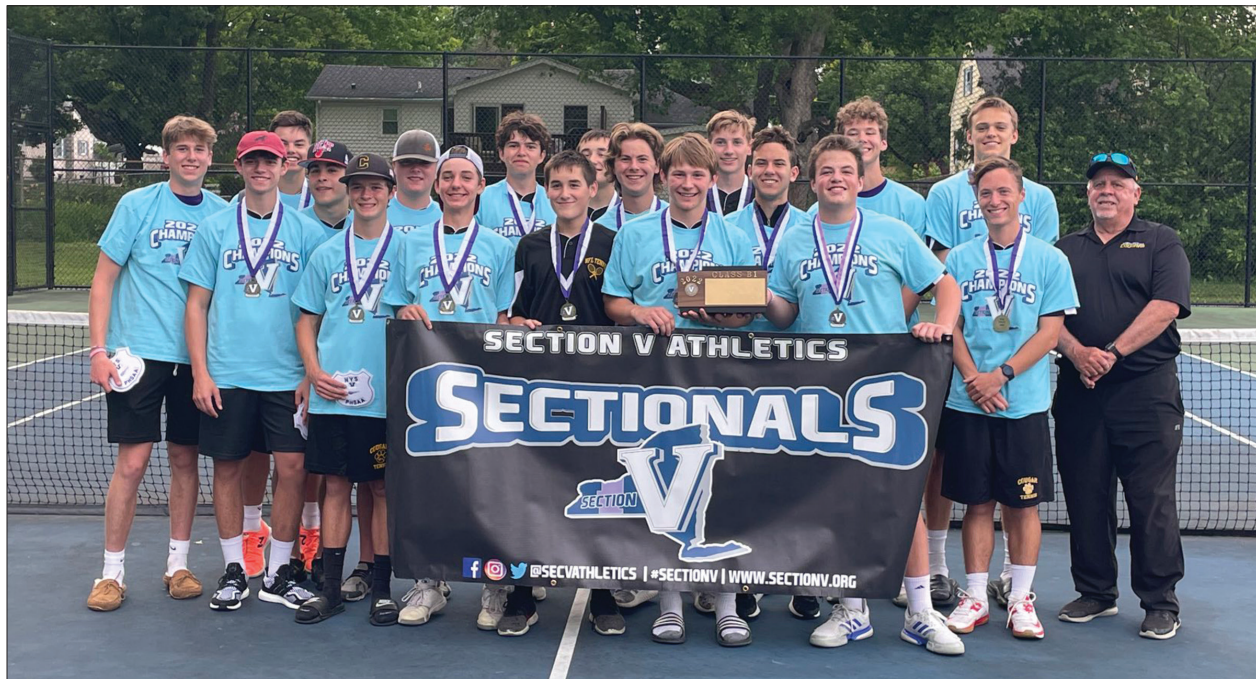

## Steve Rapp retires as boys tennis coach at HF-L

Like a tennis star who retires after winning either Wimbledon or a U.S. Open title, Honeoye Falls-Lima Varsity Tennis coach Steve Rapp went out on top as he retired last spring after guiding the Cougars to their first Section V team title in program history.

“It was just a great way to go out with the program’s first sectional team title,” said Rapp, who has coached the team since 1984. “It is cool that it coincided with that. That was just a fantastic experience and then having the fire trucks meet us at Boughton Hill Road and Route 64 and escorting our bus to the school where we were met by parents and other supporters. I will always remember how the kids just loved the experience.”

Rapp said he began mulling the possibility of retirement after getting COVID shortly after the team’s match against Churchville-Chili just before Easter break. He has also dealt with several medical issues such as sciatica, a hip replacement and a torn MCL over the past few years.

“I made the decision and told Brian (HF-L Athletic Director Brian Donohue) before individual sectionals in May but I did not tell the team members until July,” Rapp said.

A graduate of McQuaid, Rapp lived in Henrietta and Victor before his parents moved to Lima. He went to Lima High School as a freshman before

going to McQuaid in his sophomore year. He played baseball at McQuaid and then went to Geneseo State. He left Geneseo State and took a couple of years off from college, moving to Florida where he began to play tennis. He then went to Cal State-Fullerton where he played as part of a doubles team at the college.

“I remember going to Palm Springs to an ATP Tournament with a friend,” Rapp said. “At the tournament, we watched John Newcombe play and he was one of the finest players at that time.”

A former Lima resident who now lives in the city of Rochester and enjoys riding his bike along East Avenue and at Cobbs Hill, Rapp coached junior varsity baseball at Victor in 1983. He became HF-L’s boys tennis coach when Bernie Gardner, who coached the tennis team for one year, moved over to the boys track position and the tennis coach position opened up. Rapp also coached alpine skiing and freshman basketball at HF-L for a couple of years. He still does some substitute teaching, particularly in Brighton and Pittsford.

Rapp said he never really kept statistics as far as his win total as a coach was concerned, but it easily reaches a couple of hundred. What is a fact is that he led the boys tennis program to Livingston County league titles in 1986, 1993, 1995, 1996, 1997 and 2009 and Monroe County titles in

2021 and 2022; it’s up there on the HF-L Boys Tennis banner in the high school gym.

“This year was the second year in a row that we have won our division and we were undefeated in the division,” Rapp said. “I knew we had something special this year when we beat Fairport. This year is obviously the top as far as being my favorite memory. But, I also have fond memories of the players I had who went to the individual state tournament like Matt Nielsen, who played on varsity for me for five years. I still see Matt, who coaches at University of Rochester.”

Rapp stated he learned a lot over four decades of coaching, not about coaching so much as about dealing with students.

He has heard from former students, including 2022 graduate Will Tomaszewski who texted him a few months ago and thanked him for everything.

“That means a lot,” Rapp said. “I always tried to keep things in perspective. The kids remember the times after matches, the pizza parties, the bus rides home from away matches, the team camaraderie. The kids will always have those memories. I wanted to make it as good an experience as possible. I have had some great teams over the years and I know I am leaving the program in good shape.”

## Brighton/HF-L hockey starts season with 3-game win streak

With 17 players back from the 13-6-4 squad that advanced to the Section V Class A Tournament semifinals, the Brighton/Honeoye Falls-Lima Varsity Ice Hockey team could make another run deep into the postseason this winter.

Coach Brendon Rothfuss welcomed back nine returners from HF-L in seniors Peter Burslem, Kyle Reese, Trevor Reese and Braydn Trybuskiewicz, junior Grant Peinkopfer and sophomores Matthew Brassie, Emmet Landt, Natalie Loncz and Carson Meehan and eight veterans from Brighton in seniors Carter Gangarosa and Nolan Gangarosa, juniors Liam Lawrence and Shawn Oelheim and sophomores Nick Gray, Ryan Hurwitz, Brandon Taccia and Trent Wilson. Newcomers to the Bruins are freshmen Robert Jank, Patrick Rohr and Willa Runge, all from Brighton. Burslem and Trevor Reese are the team captains with assistant captains being Kyle Reese, Trybuskiewicz, Carter Gangarosa and Nolan Gangarosa.

The Bruins have plenty of firepower back in Burslem, who had 12 assists and tied for the team lead in goals last winter with 10 along with HF-L grad Hayden Meehan, Trevor Reese (eight goals, eight assists), Trybuskiewicz (seven goals, 17 assists), Nolan Gangarosa (seven goals, 10 assists), Carter Gangarosa (seven goals, nine assists) and Oelheim (six goals, eight assists). Kyle Reese (seven assists) and Brassie netted two goals each a year ago. Brighton/HF-L will not only miss the scoring of Hayden Meehan but also that of HF-L grads Gus Landt (six goals, 18 assists), Jacob Campbell (five goals, four assists), Griffin Mayo (four goals, seven assists), Chance Bears (three goals, 13 assists) and Ethan Ford (three goals, 11 assists) and Brighton grads Paul Runge (six goals, 13 assists) and Eric Morrell (four goals, eight assists).

Hurwitz is the starting goalie after splitting time last winter. Brassie, Trybuskiewicz, Lawrence and Gray are the top defensemen while one forward line features Burslem, Trevor Reese and Carter Gangarosa and the other features Landt, Nolan Gangarosa and Oelheim.

“We have a good mix of veterans and new players,” Rothfuss stated. “We have good leadership from our seniors and a strong group of kids who want to win. They are a hard-working team.”

Brighton/HF-L defeated Hilton 6-1 on November 29 in the season opener. Trybuskiewicz scored 49 seconds into the game, assisted by Burslem, and the Bruins held that 1-0 lead throughout the remainder of the first period. Trybuskiewicz struck for the team’s second goal just over four minutes into the second period, this time off an assist from Oelheim. That opened up a three-goal flurry by the Bruins in that period. Emmet Landt scored on a power play opportunity following a Hilton penalty for interference. Lawrence and Brassie assisted on that goal. Nolan Gangarosa gave the club a 4-0 lead after two periods with a goal off assists by Oelheim and Brassie with about two minutes left in the period. Although Brighton/HF-L was skating shorthanded due to roughing penalty, the Bruins notched their fifth goal when Nolan Gangarosa got his second of the game unassisted just over a minute into the third period. Peinkopfer (Wilson, Kyle Reese assisting) scored midway through the third period. Hilton scored on the power play with about five minutes left in the game. Hurwitz had 22 saves.

“Grant scored his first varsity goal,” Rothfuss said.

The Bruins routed Lewiston-Porter (from the Buffalo area) 9-2 on December 2. Trevor Reese (Oelheim and Nolan Gangarosa assists) scored 26 seconds into the game and Emmet Landt made it a 2-0 lead three minutes later, assisted by Burslem and Carter Gangarosa. Five different players scored in the second period with Oelheim (Nolan Gangarosa assist) beginning the surge nine seconds into the period. Nolan Gangarosa (Oelheim assist), Gray (Oelheim and Trybuskiewicz assisting) on a power play after a crosschecking penalty, Wilson (Trybuskiewicz assist) and Emmet Landt (Burslem and Lawrence assisting) added the other goals as the Bruins went ahead 7-0. LewPort cut the lead with its first goal of the game early in the third period. Lawrence (Carter Gangarosa assist) capitalized on the power play following a kneeling penalty and Kyle Reese (Brassie assist) closed the scoring with goals in the final period. Hurwitz (18 saves) split time in goal with Jank (two saves).

Brighton/HF-L ended the week by edging Williamsville East 2-1 on December 3. After a scoreless first period, Landt and Nolan Gangarosa each scored an unassisted goal with under four minutes left in the second period. Williamsville East netted its only goal with just over a minute remaining in the game. Hurwitz stopped 34 shots.

“We have showed some great balance as far as scoring goals, getting contributions from a lot of players in our first three games,” Rothfuss said. “We don’t have just one or two kids that opponents can concentrate on. Williamsville East was a good team and a great test for us.”

The Bruins played Pittsford on December 6 and Churchville-Chili on December 8.

## HF-L swimmers capture 3 wins

The Honeoye Falls-Lima Boys Varsity Swim team is hoping some of the glow that surrounded the Lady Cougars' run to a Section V swim title this fall rubs off their squad this winter. They might have a head start on the girls, which had 11 members, as the boys team has 24 members.

Coach Ari Freedman-Weiss welcomes back 18 members of the team which went 8-2 last winter and took second at the Section V Class B Championship. They are seniors Griffin Englert, Christian Vitale and Jack Wirth, juniors Domenic Baker, Jared Bhaskaran, Adam Bianchi, Michael Dovichi, Galen Henderson, Cameron McCaffrey, Kellen McCaffrey, Grant McGunnigle, Miles Stover, Daniel Zornow and Jonas Zweirlin, sophomore Lucas Puchades and freshmen Charles Dovichi, Clayton Tommy Lowe and Nicolas Vitale. Newcomers to the squad are freshmen Aaron Campbell, Kinnick Cates, Dean McGunnigle, Archer Sifling and Albert Zhang and eighth-grader Aaron Gurell.

"As far as this season goes, I look forward to watching their progression and seeing how far they progress," Freedman-Weiss said. "We have some depth and that will help us."

HF-L captured three wins in the Quad Meet at Gates Chili on November 29 as the Cougars overpowered Gates 216-70, Rochester City School District United 188-94 and Rush-Henrietta 158-134. Wirth, Englert, Bianchi and Christian Vitale got the meet started with a victory in the 200 medley relay as they clocked 1 minute, 49.49 seconds. Zornow, Zweirlin, Henderson and Michael Dovichi collected fifth (2:03.74). Christian Vitale clocked 2:04.31 for second, Nicolas Vitale a 2:07.73 for third and Lowe a 2:12.77 for fourth in the 200 freestyle. Puchades posted a 2:48.50 for eighth in the event. Wirth won the 200 individual medley with a 2:13.46 time. Englert came in fifth (2:31.05) and Baker eighth (2:42.15).

Bianchi placed third in the 50 freestyle in 24.21 seconds. Grant McGunnigle followed in seventh at 25.30 seconds, Michael Dovichi eighth at 25.71 seconds and Stover 11<sup>th</sup> at 26.60 seconds. Charles Dovichi compiled 175.85 points to win the diving. Lowe finished third (1:05.24), Bianchi fifth (1:09.41), Henderson sixth (1:12.86) and Nicolas Vitale seventh (1:12.89) in the 100 butterfly. Grant McGunnigle swam to fourth at 59.06 seconds in the 100 freestyle, just ahead of Michael Dovichi in fifth at 59.67 seconds. Stover ended up eighth (1:03.14) and Gurell ninth (1:03.32) in the event. Christian Vitale was second (5:35.33), Zornow fourth (6:28.20), Baker fifth (6:50.66) and Bhaskaran seventh (7:12.59) in the 500 freestyle.

Lowe, Grant McGunnigle, Bianchi and Englert teamed for a time of 1:41.12 to notch third in the 200 freestyle relay while Baker, Gurell, Cameron McCaffrey and Stover combined for a 1:54.58 for sixth. Wirth won the 100 backstroke in 57.34 seconds while Zornow took sixth (1:12.05), Cameron McCaffrey seventh (1:16.01) and Kellen McCaffrey 10<sup>th</sup> (1:22.75). Englert placed fourth at 1:15.83, Zweirlin fifth at 1:16.13, Bhaskaran sixth at 1:18.97 and Zhang ninth at 1:28.67 in the 100 breaststroke. Christian Vitale, Lowe, Michael Dovichi and Wirth clocked a winning 3:45.57 in the 400 freestyle relay with Baker, Zornow, Puchades and Gurell claiming fifth (4:53.97).

"Jack had a great meet, winning all four of the events he was in," Freedman-Weiss said. "I was really pleased with how all our juniors did in the meet. Charles' point total in the diving event was a personal record."

The Cougars bowed 99-79 to Penfield on December 1. Wirth, Englert, Lowe and Bianchi finished second at 1:50.36 in the medley relay. Christian Vitale collected second (2:00.68) and Michael Dovichi fifth (2:11.43) in the 200 free. Wirth won the 200 IM with a time of 2:13.28 with Lowe fourth at 2:26.49 and Grant McGunnigle fifth at 2 minutes, 38.66 seconds. Bianchi cruised to second at 24.75 seconds and Stover fourth at 26.29 seconds in the 50 freestyle. Charles Dovichi accumulated 154.35 points to win the diving. Lowe (1:06.92), Michael Dovichi (1:08.53) and Bianchi (1:13.27) were third, fourth and fifth in the 100 butterfly. Englert posted a time of 57.67 seconds for second and Grant McGunnigle 59.56 seconds for third in the 100 free. Christian Vitale turned a 5:35.36 for second and Zweirlin a 6:22.65 for fifth in the 500 free. Bianchi, Englert, Lowe and Christian Vitale teamed for a 1:44.73 for second in the 200 free relay. Wirth swept to a win in the 100 backstroke in 57.05 seconds, followed by Zornow in third (1:10.62) and Cameron McCaffrey fifth (1:14.75). Englert posted a 1:14.83 for third and Zweirlin a 1:14.99 for fourth in the breaststroke. Wirth, Grant McGunnigle, Michael Dovichi and Christian Vitale clocked 3:44.22 to win the 400 free relay when Penfield went exhibition in the event.

"I was really happy with how the kids swam in the two meets," Freedman-Weiss said. "Charles is still getting better; he's doing some higher degree dives than last year. Penfield was third in the Section V Class A Championships last year. It was a good test for us and we had three kids out sick."

While some local high school girls basketball fans might question where the Honeoye Falls-Lima Girls Varsity Basketball team falls when talking about the top teams in Section V this season after graduating star center Teagan Kamm, it's not a good thing to count out the Lady Cougars.

Coach Steve Willoughby returns seven members from last year's 15-6 squad which won the Monroe County Division 4 before losing in the Section V Class A quarterfinals. Those players are seniors Marlee Green, Grace Hoffman, Samantha Osovski and Clare Ruff, junior Mollie Finn, sophomore Caroline Smith and freshman Shaye Angelo. Green, Ruff and Finn are the team's captains. Although Kamm (17.1 points per game) and fellow HF-L 2022 grad Whitley Easton (9.6 ppg) were the team's top scorers last year, Ruff was the third-leading scorer at 7.9 a game, Angelo the fourth-leading scorer at 5.1 a game and Smith the fifth-leading scorer at 4.9 a game. Green chipped in 3.1 points a game and both Hoffman and Osovski were at 2.5 a game.

Newcomers joining the varsity this year are senior Juliette Ambrose (an exchange student from France) and juniors Katie Adams, Reese Duset, Paige Kidd and Maddy Schubach.

The starters are Angelo, Green, Hoffman, Ruff and Smith. Ruff, who led the team in assists with 103 and steals with 120, is the starting point guard. Kamm was the leading rebounder a year ago with almost 300, but Smith was second with 87 and Hoffman, Osovski, Ruff, Finn and Angelo all had over 30 rebounds.

"Maddy, Mollie and Sam could also pick up a start here or there," Willoughby said. "We don't have that stellar 6-footer in the middle like we had with Teagan, but I think Caroline will create some matchup problems for opponents. She can play in the post but she can get up and down the floor. She is quick in the post while Teagan

brought muscle and power. This is an incredibly athletic team and a smart bunch. We also have some good kids up from JV like Reese who was the leading scorer there. We will play a lot of man-to-man defense and 1-3-1 zone defense."

HF-L began the season with a 68-28 victory over a combined Greece Athena/Odyssey team on December 1. While the final score looks like a rout, the game was close early on. HF-L led just 13-7 after the first quarter. The Lady Cougars extended the lead out in the second quarter behind 11 points from Angelo, who scored all her points in the first half. She made five 3-pointers for the game. HF-L held a 34-19 halftime advantage. The Cougars sealed the game though during a 21-3 run over the third quarter. With Greece guarding Angelo closer, Smith and Schubach benefitted from that and led the charge in the period. Smith scored 8 points in the quarter and Schubach 5. HF-L led 55-22 after three quarters. Ruff also picked up the scoring load in the second half with six of her points.

Angelo racked up 17 points with three rebounds. Smith finished with 12 points, three rebounds, two steals and one assist. Ruff added 9 points, 10 assists and six steals. Schubach had 9 points and seven rebounds. Green popped in 7 points with two rebounds. Hoffman netted 6 points with six rebounds. Kidd collected 4 points and six rebounds. Osovski notched 2 points with five steals. Duset tallied 2 points. Finn contributed two assists and one rebound.

"We were a bit nervous in the first quarter, but the kids settled down," Willoughby said. "We pressed and trapped them in the second and third quarter and wore them down. I think Athena is better than the final score looks."

The Honeoye Falls-Lima Boys Varsity Basketball team has some experience coming back this year and will continue the type of tenacious defense that it has been known for the past few years.

New coach Corey Allmond has veterans back in seniors Carson Joint, Nolan Smith, Samuel Vogt and Trent Wager and junior Drew Angelo. In addition, juniors Wyatt Huff, Madut Mathuc and Aidan Neenan also saw time on the varsity. Newcomers to the club are juniors Austyn Crego, Landon Hammond, Paul Iacobucci, Chase Perryman and Owen Smith.

HF-L lost its season opener 64-49 on December 2 to a Pittsford Mendon squad that returns several players from its sectional title team of a year ago. The Vikings ran out to a 26-16 lead after the first quarter and extended that to 42-25 at halftime. HF-L trailed 50-33 at the end of three quarters.

Angelo garnered 22 points, Smith 18, Perryman 7 and Huff 2.

"The first quarter was what really hurt us," Allmond said. "Their star player Ryan Deuel had 29 points for the game, 21 of those in the first half and many of those in the first quarter. The second half, we played better as we put a box-and-one on Deuel. We turned the ball over 22 times, but we forced 19 turnovers from them. They made nine 3-pointers and we had three 3-pointers. We had 12 offensive rebounds among our 35 rebounds for the game and outrebounded them 35-29."

boiler replacement, the public address notification system, new playground equipment and paving of the East parking lot.

Manor School would receive \$2,723,397 in the project. That money would be funding renovations to the fitness/physical education office and storage renovations, roof access ladder and hatch, HVAC improvements at the Data Closet, fire alarm panel and heating mains, drinking fountain fixtures and piping replacement, public address notification system and paving improvements on the entry drive and near the play area and sidewalks.

The remainder of the project (\$812,130) will go to replacement of the deteriorating track, fuel tank replacement at the Operations Center and improving the pathways that connect the High School to the Manor School to the Middle School on the

## Mayor, Supervisor Weekly Update As Of Friday, December 2nd Mendon & Rush Fire Commissioner Elections, HF-L Cap Vote

### Village of Honeoye Falls

Rick Milne, Mayor:

"The Toys For Tots in the southern Monroe County area collection is underway in our greater community. This effort began in 2012 and while centered in the Village of Honeoye Falls, this effort serves families in need in Honeoye Falls, Mendon, Lima, Livonia, Bloomfield, and West Bloomfield and has also supported families in Hemlock, Pittsford, Rush, and southern Henrietta. There have even been families from Geneseo, Brighton, Greece and Rochester that have been helped as special needs arise."

"When the program began, there were 10 boxes out for collection and about 900 toys were collected that supported 75 families. Today, there are almost 30 boxes placed and over 3000 toys/items are normally collected and provided to families in need. In 2020 over 786 children that the group knew of were supported! This is an incredible effort led by Deb O'Brien and the Kade Foundation members and we are blessed to have this opportunity to support those in need and to get support if needed. Please look for the Toys For Tots Box and donate an unwrapped toy, book or give a gift card! A big thank you to Deb O'Brien and those that assist her for their efforts in organizing this over the past 10 years!"

"Many businesses are looking forward to and supporting the storefront/building decorating contest this year. December 8th will be the day that the 'judging' takes place, and the winner will be announced after the Christmas parade which is set for December 10th in the evening beginning at 6:00 PM."

"Honeoye Falls - Scout Troop 10 - Annual Holiday/Christmas tree sales are in process now as well. If you need a holiday/Christmas tree, please consider supporting the Troop 10 Scouts fundraiser."

"Our Village promotional video series is in its final review process and we are excited to get that piece posted! Be watching for that in the next few weeks."

### Town of Mendon

John Moffitt, Supervisor:

"Good afternoon, everybody. Once again, I'm glad to be here."

"Our military memorial, Spray Park on Semmel Road is progressing. We should be doing a walk through next week, and we're going to test everything as weather provides before the end of the year. And I would imagine we'll be opening the park sometime in May for the season. Those dates are yet to be determined."

"As Rick mentioned, the Honeoye Falls Fire Department parade on December the tenth is a big event in the community. I certainly suggest to everyone to come out for that. It's one of the nicest events we have in the community."

"Also, as Gerry mentioned, there's some votes coming up. One is for the Mendon Fire District Commissioners. That is for anyone who is eligible to vote in, that has to live within the Mendon Fire District parameters. If you check your tax bill, you will be able to tell if you pay taxes in the Mendon Fire District. That is from 4-9 PM at the Mendon Fire Hall on the Mendon-Ionia Road."

"Also on December thirteenth, for those of you who live in the Honeoye Falls-Lima School District, there is a capital project vote from 9AM-9PM. That is at the Board of Education Room, which is located off the circle on Church Street. So, I encourage everyone who's eligible to vote."

"And hopefully, one last thing I forgot to mention on our website. We have a very detailed description on snow removal within the Town of Mendon. If you have any questions about maybe a sidewalk, or when your road is plowed, and various things like that, definitely check the Town of Mendon website. Our highway department has posted a quite lengthy description of various plowing, and when it's done, and why it's done on there. So please refer to that. If you have any questions, call the Highway Department"

### Town of Rush

Genald Kusse, Supervisor:

"Everything is just peachy keen in the Town of Rush and we're going to keep it that way. We've got the holidays coming up and I want to wish everyone a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year and let you know of a couple of events that are taking place."

"One is our senior luncheon. Unfortunately, it will have taken place by the time this report goes out, but I agree with Mike that people who are eligible by residence, but not even by Residency, but by age, are more than welcome to join the Rush Seniors. They have a lot of good trips every year. They have a lot of good luncheons every year, and I enjoy going there and talking to the people, and they seem to enjoy having someone outside of their normal routine to talk to."

"The December fourteenth Town Board meeting will offer an in person for those who want to attend, or a Zoom component for those who want to sit in the comfort of their home and watch the Board meeting. I think there will be a lot of new and exciting things that get announced at that meeting, and I hope that a lot of people interested in what goes on in our community, how this administration is managing it, and hope they get some rewards from participating through watching or attending that board meeting."

"We've been troubled by a number of resignations from our subboards. That's the Zoning Board, the Planning Board and the Conservation Board. For any Rush resident - that requires residency to participate - for any Rush residents who would like to participate on one of those subboards, I encourage you to provide a letter of interest to the Town Clerk, Pamela Bucci. We could sure use your help."

"We keep a list of interested residents, but our list has dwindled significantly because we've had so many resignations. They're not really resignations. A couple are, but most of them are that they've reached the end of their term limit, so they choose to seek other pleasures. And we've got to backfill with someone."

"The Rush budget has been submitted. It went to the County Budget Director, and it goes to the State. It was not without some strains here and there, but we made it, and I think it's a good budget. The best thing about it is our board kept the taxes at 3.1%, and that's significantly lower than it's been in recent years. That was the focus of our goal to make sure that we didn't increase taxes. One of the reasons for that is the Fire Department has recently decided to hire some full-time personnel. So, they had to go through their process, increase taxes for the fire service in 2023 and, rather than add to that burden, we decided to not raise taxes this year again, which is a good thing."

"The water project that we've talked about so many times is on track to getting somewhere, and I don't say that casually. I say somewhere, because we don't know where that's going, because it is starting in the near future, we'll be talking about some need for a large amount of money, and the only way that we can get them is through grant activity and the grant process is very, very complicated, as most people are aware, and we hope that we can at least get water to those people who are in dire need."

"I want to remind everyone that next Tuesday night, I believe it is the Fire Commissioner's election. The candidates who are up for election will be available in the voting place, and I encourage everyone to go and vote for a commissioner because of how the Commissioners see the need for fire apparatus and facilities, etc. is going to de-

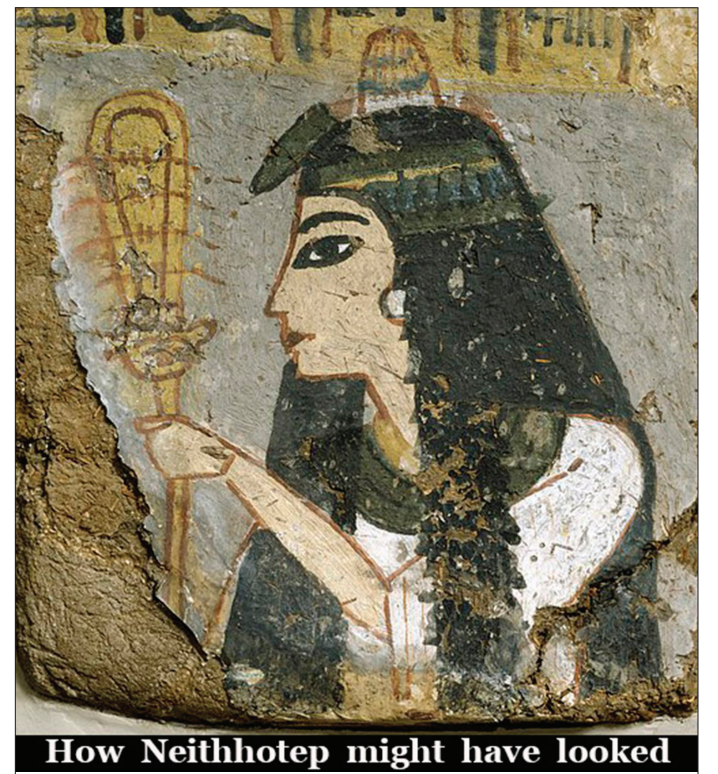

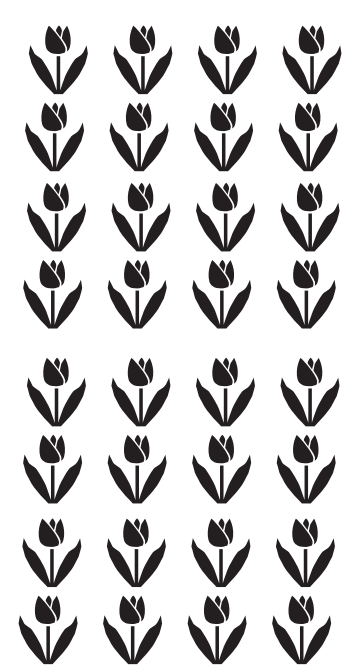
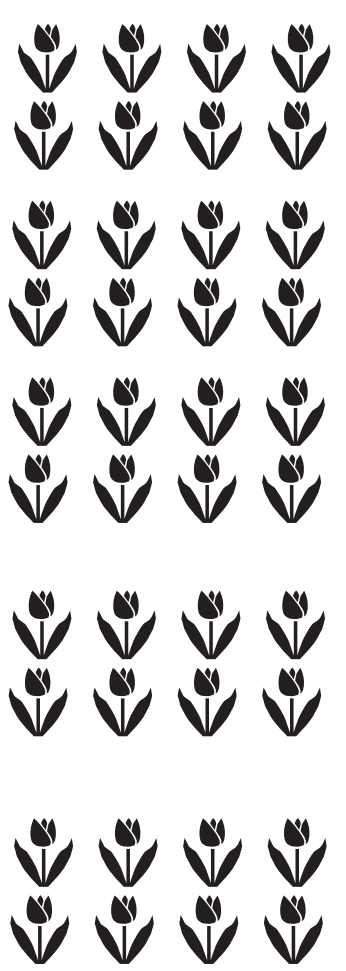

We've spent the past few years searching high and low to unearth the most intriguing tales you've probably never been told. As you've come to know by now, we like to have our way with the bizarre and intriguing.

In our research, we archived a couple dozen polls which ranked the funniest females in entertainment history. Then we subsequently took all those polls, averaged them together, and came up with our list of the 100 Funniest Females of All Time. The entire list will be in the book and it's certainly a conversation starter. This week we'll share the story of the woman who shows up at #9 in that list, namely Phyllis Diller.

Hair askew and nose aglow, with

eccentric sense of self-deprecation on full display, Phyllis Diller's performances are always profusely punctuated by the clamoring cacophony of her caustically cackling laughter. The comedic concept of laughing at your own jokes has been replicated by other comedians, in particular Eddie

Murphy and Roseanne Barr, with the latter acknowledging Phyllis as one of her primary influences.

Self-deprecation, of course, is the other Diller discipline that Roseanne double dishes in deadly doses. Oh, and who can forget the long thin Cruella de Vil-inspired cigarette holder? For the record, let it be known that in Phyllis's case, the cigarettes are just props.

Growing up as kids in the 1960's, Phyllis Diller is the pre-eminent female stand-up comedienne of the decade and the only one that is truly a household name. Sure, you have female sitcom stars like Mary Tyler Moore and variety show stars like Carol Burnett, but there aren't many women who just walk up to the microphone and start telling jokes. Joan Rivers' heyday is still a few years down the road.

The strangest aspect of Phyllis Diller's career is that for a woman who ends up so highly enshrined in the pantheon of female comics, she starts her career at a surprisingly advanced age. She makes her first broadcasting appearance of any kind on an Oakland, California radio station in 1952 at the age of 34.

And when will we see our girl on TV?

Later that year, her first film appearances occur in the form of 15-minute TV segments in which

she appears in a housecoat offering intentionally ridiculous advice to homemakers. The name of the show is... *Phyllis Diller, (sic) the Homely Friendmaker*. Note the intentional juxtaposition of the wording on that title. She's not "the friendly homemaker," she's "the homely friendmaker." The housecoat attire foreshadows her garishly dressed future persona.

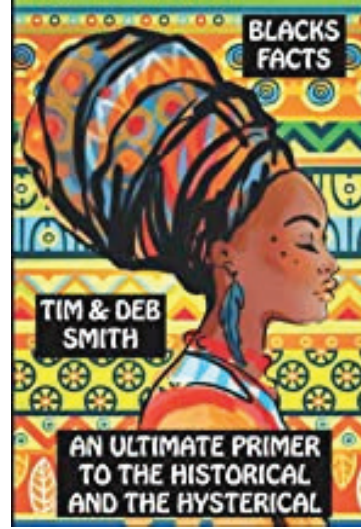
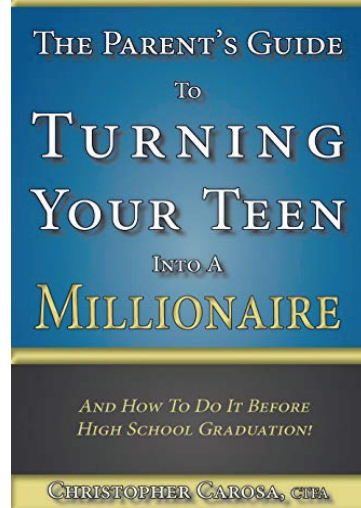
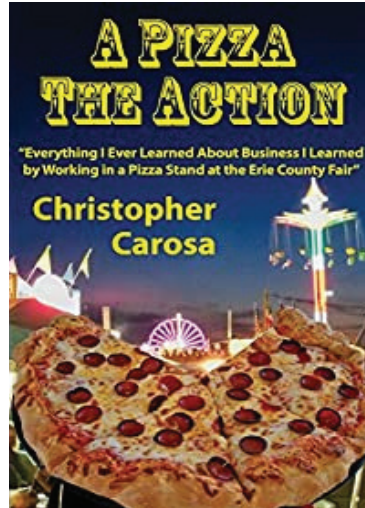
**COMEDY CLUB QUEEN** - Phyllis is 37 when she makes her stand-up debut at the Purple Onion club in San Francisco. She wows the crowds and what is originally booked to be a two-week gig runs for almost two years. Diller's first husband encourages her comedic venture and when she becomes the bread winner of the relationship, she jokes that, "I became a stand-up comedienne because I had a sit-down husband." Let the games begin.

She breaks into television in 1958 with escalating success. Starting with Groucho Marx's *You Bet Your Life* game show, she follows with appearances on *The Tonight Show Starring Jack Parr* and *The Ed Sullivan Show*. The rest of the 1960's sees a proliferation of Phyllis Diller appearances.

She is a frequent guest on shows like *Rowan and Martin's Laugh-In* and *The Hollywood Squares*. Her sitcom *The Pruitts of Southampton* runs during the
